New Ship Rates to the Levant.

Complying with the demands of exporters for more favorable ship rates to the Levant, the Shipping Board has announced new ship rates to North African ports of call, Egyptian ports, Turkey, Red Sea ports and Malta. On general cargoes the rates are \$1.60 per 100 pounds or 87½ cents per cubic foot to North Africa, Egyptian ports, Turkey, via Alexandretta, Beirut and Smyrna, and Red Sea ports, via Aden and Hodeida, and \$1.75 per 100 pounds or \$1 per cubic foot to Malta, via Valetta.

Special rates also were put into effect on cargoes of alcohol, grains, canned fruits, condensed milk, iron and steel articles, lumber, oil and many other commodities consigned to the Levant. The new shipping tariff of the board put into effect is as follows:

Minimum charge: Minimum bill of lading charge will be \$10.

Heavy lift scale: Rates apply on pieces or packages weighing up to and including two tons. On pieces or packages weighing over two tons the regular rates, plus \$5 per ton of 2,240 pounds, for each addition ton over two tons to be added.

Extra length scale: For pieces or packages exceeding thirty feet in length, an additional charge of 1c per 100 pounds for each foot or fraction over thirty feet, will be made.

Lghterage, if required, at risk and expense of cargo.

L'AVENIR DE CONSTANTINOPLE.

Allocution de Monsieur Ravndal, Consul Général des Etats-Unis d'Amérique, à l'Assemblée des Etudiants de Robert College, en Mars 1917.

(Traduit de l'Américain et publié à la demande des membres de la Chambre de Commerce)

Mes chers amis,

Je viens aujourd'hui faire appel à votre jeune imagination en vous invitant à me suivre en une promenade à travers les airs, —les aéroplanes n'ont-ils pas mis ce genre d'excursions à notre portée?— promenade qui nous procurera une vue d'ensemble, à vol d'oiseau, de l'histoire commerciale de Constantinople. A la façon des enfants, représentons-nous cette histoire à l'aide d'images et donnons lui l'apparence d'un paysage.

Du haut de ce point d'observation éminemment favorable, nous voyons se dérouler à nos pieds des ravins profonds, de vastes plaines et de hauts sommets. Cependant notre attention est tout particulièrement attirée et retenue par trois pics très élevés qui dominant le paysage. D'énormes distances les séparent; pareils à ces bornes gigantesques, ils marquent des périodes d'une extraordinaire prospérité matérielle et d'une expansion commerciale exceptionnelle.

Le mont qui se détache là-bas, à l'horizon, c'est la première, mais aussi la moins remarquable de ces trois bornes; nous y lisons les chiffres 196, qui, j'imagine, marquent l'apogée de l'ère de progrès commencée dès la fondation même de Byzance, vers l'an 650 av. J.-C. et à laquelle Septime Sévère mit brusquement fin en 196, en anéantissant presque complètement la ville. Pendant ces 750 années l'antique cité avait eu bien des hauts et des bas. Il vous souvient peut être d'avoir lu, dans vos livres d'histoire, que les Perses s'en rendirent maîtres après avoir traversé le Bosphore ici même, à Rouméli Hissar, au pied de la colline que couronne votre collègue. Néanmoins qu'elle se trouvait sous la domination étrangère ou qu'elle fit partie de la confédération athénienne, il y a tout lieu de croire que, grâce à l'extension de son activité commerciale et à l'influence qu'elle exerçait, Byzance, qui travaillait dès lors à son propre avenir, était devenue, même en ces temps reculés, une cité florissante et prospère. Du reste, ce développement est dû en grande partie, sinon entièrement, à la position géographique de la ville qui lui permit de percevoir des droits sur le trafic et sur la navigation à travers les Dardanelles et le Bosphore.

Infiniment plus près de nous et pourtant plus ou moins enveloppé dans les brumes du passé, un second pic monumental s'élève et domine le paysage. La date qu'il porte à son sommet marque assurément la fin, survenue en 1204, d'une seconde période d'immense extension commerciale et de prestige inouï. Vous n'avez certes pas oublié, qu'après avoir été détruite par Septime Sévère, et reconstruite en 330 par l'Empereur Constantin, la belle ville de Constantinople était devenue le centre de l'Empire Romain. Vous n'ignorez pas non plus que c'est sur l'instigation des Vénitiens que les croisés renoncèrent à l'expédition qu'ils projetaient contre ceux que l'on appelait les infidèles, dans le but de les chasser d'Égypte, pour attaquer Constantinople, dont ils s'emparèrent en 1204, ruinant, du coup, cette suprématie commerciale dont ses rivaux étaient jaloux. Cette expédition, qui provoqua l'indignation du Pape Innocent III, est désignée dans l'histoire sous le nom de Conquête Latine ou de Quatrième Croisade.

Durant les 750 années qui s'étaient écoulées depuis que la Nouvelle Rome avait repris son essor, deux facteurs avait tout particulièrement contribué à la prospérité et à la gloire de Constantinople. Pendant la première période, nous avons constaté que Byzance tenait la clef des détroits entre la Mer Méditerranée et la Mer Noire. Pendant la seconde période, nous avons affaire à deux faits essentiels et fondamentaux; nous constatons que Constantinople était devenue alors le point d'union des deux principales routes commerciales du monde, la route qui mène d'Europe en Asie, par voie de terre, et la voie de navigation maritime de la Méditerranée à la Mer Noire. Les marchands du Nord et du Sud, d'Orient et d'Occident s'y rencontraient. C'était le but des caravanes venant de Chine, des Indes et de la Perse, qui y portaient les soies, les épices et les bijoux que recherchaient les peuples encore à demi barbares de l'Occident. A leur tour, les Amalfitains, les Pisans, les Génois, les Vénitiens et les Normands y portaient le bois de construction, le fer et les peaux dont les peuples orientaux et méridionaux avaient besoin. Constantinople devint alors le centre du monde. Attirés par le magnétisme qu'exerçait l'or byzantin, des étrangers y affluèrent de tous les points de l'univers; ils s'y établirent en communautés régies par leurs lois propres et soumises à l'autorité de magistrats désignés par les gouvernements de leurs pays d'origine. Il y avait, en ce temps là, plusieurs autres villes importantes telles que Bagdad, ville arabe du Levant, et les cités mauresques de l'Espagne à l'Ouest. Au Nord, dans la Mer Baltique, la ville de Wisby devint la mère de la future Ligue Hanséatique.

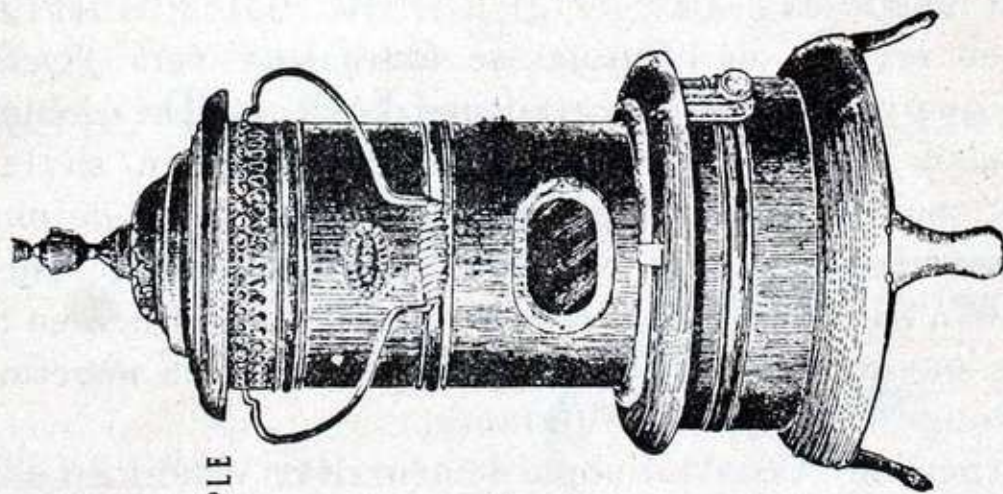

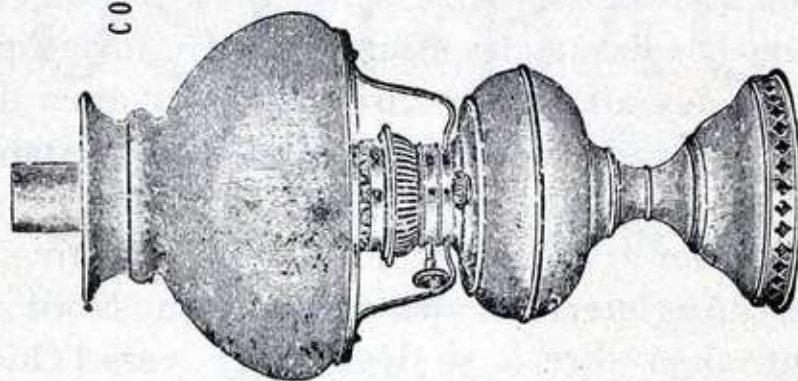

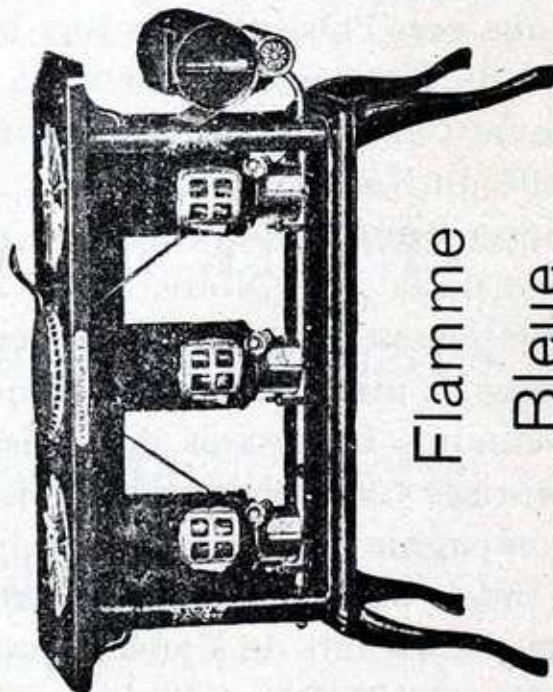

Akka, la capitale des croisés, et Alexandrie, la ville des Sultans d'Égypte, acquirent alors une célébrité qui attira bien des navires et bien des marchands. Cependant Constantinople était le pivot autour duquel se mouvait le monde des affaires.

Ayant donc réussi à porter un coup mortel à l'orgueil et à la prospérité de sa rivale, Vénise acheva son œuvre en faisant petit à petit dévier le courant des affaires vers l'Adriatique. Désormais, le mouvement des affaires se dirigeait, pour ainsi dire, de l'Est à l'Ouest. Les vaisseaux marchands d'Italie, de la France méridionale et de l'Espagne orientale traversèrent les Colonnes d'Hercule et se mirent à trafiquer avec les peuples à demi barbares qui habitaient la Belgique, l'Angleterre et les contrées du Nord. Le commerce tendait, pour ainsi dire, à se développer vers l'Ouest et à suivre, pour changer le cours du Rhin vers l'Occident plutôt que celui du Danube vers l'Orient. Dès lors la Ligue Hanséatique était formée; l'astre de Constantinople était à son déclin: la découverte de la route du Cap de Bonne Espérance et des Indes par Vasco de Gama et celle du Nouveau Monde par Christophe Colomb achevèrent de l'éclipser presque totalement; à part le commerce des marchandises venant de la Mer Noire, toute autre activité commerciale y avait complètement cessé. La route vers l'Orient ne traversait plus Constantinople; ainsi, le facteur principal de sa grandeur passée avait été éliminé. Désormais les vaisseaux qui étaient au service des entreprises commerciales les plus importantes de l'époque, telles que la Compagnie Hollandaise des Indes Orientales suivaient, en allant aux Indes, une route toute autre que celle qui, avant la Conquête Latine, avait fait de Constantinople le centre financier et commercial du monde.

Les regards de l'Europe se tournaient vers l'Occident; les routes que suivaient les caravanes d'Asie étaient oubliées. Il est vrai qu'un revirement se produisit au milieu du siècle dernier; l'attention du monde des affaires se porta une fois de plus vers la Méditerranée; la P. & O. Steamship Company établit une ligne de Londres à Alexandrie et une autre de Bombay à Suez, en les reliant par de longues files de chameaux qui faisaient la navette entre la Mer Rouge et la Mer Méditerranée.

Cependant, Constantinople demeurait en dehors du mouvement et son avenir paraissait bien sombre. . . . Elle était, pour ainsi dire, entraînée par le remous en dehors du courant international des affaires. L'ouverture du canal de Suez, en 1867, vint encore, si possible, assombrir cette perspective déjà si peu encourageante. Cependant ainsi qu'il arrive souvent dans l'histoire des individus et des peu-

ples, le proverbe américain qui dit "qu'il ne fait jamais aussi noir qu'avant l'aurore" semble avoir eu raison une fois de plus.

La première période de progrès que nous rencontrons dans l'histoire de Constantinople eut donc une durée d'environ 750 années jusqu'à l'an 106, date de la prise de la ville par les Romains. La seconde période de progrès, qui commença lors de la reconstruction de la ville par l'empereur Constantin, vers l'an 330, et qui se termina en 1204 par la Conquête Latine, eut également une durée d'environ 750 années. Nous voici donc arrivés au troisième pic que nous pouvons entrevoir du haut de notre position élevée dans les airs. Il est à peine visible, sa vague silhouette étant enveloppée d'une brume que nos yeux n'arrivent pas à pénétrer; mais il nous apparaît gros de promesses pour l'avenir et nous inclinons à croire que le temps est proche où il se révélera dans toute sa splendeur, plus monumental et plus grandiose que tous les autres. . . . 712 années se sont écoulées depuis la Conquête Latine et nous constatons autour de nous et dans tous les sens des signes précurseurs d'une autre grande renaissance et d'un nouveau développement de l'activité commerciale de Constantinople. En 1888, on construisit un chemin de fer qui relia le centre de l'Europe au Bosphore; actuellement on est en train de prolonger cette ligne jusque vers le Golfe Persique. Ainsi Constantinople se trouve, une fois de plus, placée sur le point d'intersection de deux des voies de communication les plus importantes du monde. Un jour cette voie ferrée se prolongera jusqu'à Calcutta, puis jusqu'à Shanghai. Ses embranchements se multiplieront dans toutes les directions, de sorte que le hinterland de Constantinople s'étendra bien au delà de ses limites au Moyen Age. Le temps est proche où l'on pourra prendre le train à Paris pour se rendre au Cap par voie de Constantinople. En ce cas, je ne sais trop comment on s'y prendra pour traverser le Bosphore. On a déjà projeté la construction d'un pont qui relierait Roumeli-Hissar à Candilli, tout en étant assez haut pour ne pas gêner la navigation. Il a été également question de construire un tunnel sous-marin, qui permettrait aux trains de traverser le Bosphore. A mon sens, l'adoption d'un système de bacs, paraît plus probable, à l'instar du système qui a été adopté dans la mer Baltique; 1° de Sasnitz à Trelleborg; 2° de Warnemunde à Gedser. Ces bacs pourraient éventuellement faire communiquer Psamatia, où l'on projette de construire le nouveau port de Constantinople, et Haidar Pacha, de sorte que l'on pourrait voyager de Paris au Caire sans changer de train.

Non seulement le premier facteur fondamental, c'est-à-dire

l'établissement d'une voie de communication directe entre l'Europe et l'Asie, par voie de terre, rentre une fois de plus en ligne de compte, mais aussi le second facteur de prospérité, la voie maritime qui reflète les minarets de Stamboul, acquiert à son tour une importance nouvelle et toujours grandissante. Je m'en réfère tout particulièrement aux projets qui sont à l'étude depuis vingt-cinq ans et dont l'exécution a été singulièrement accélérée par la guerre actuelle, projets concernant la création des voies de navigation intérieure donnant passage à des vapeurs jaugeant 1.000 tonnes qui relieront l'Océan Atlantique, la mer du Nord et la mer Baltique à la mer Noire. Quelques-uns de ces canaux feront communiquer le Rhin et le Danube; d'autres relieront l'Elbe et l'Oder au Danube; d'autres encore réuniront la mer Noire par la jonction de certains fleuves de la Russie que l'on aura rendus navigables en les canalisant.

En regardant la carte que vous avez sous les yeux, vous vous rendrez compte que le Ludwig Canal qui réunit Ratisbonne en Bavière et Bamberg sur le Main est déjà livré à la circulation. Il est actuellement question d'augmenter la profondeur de ce canal ou bien d'en creuser un nouveau qui établira la jonction du Danube au Rhin entre Ulm et Karlsruhe. D'autre part on projette l'embranchement, par la Moldau, de la ligne du Danube vers celle de l'Elben. Il est également question de mettre en communication directe le Danube et l'Oder, au moyen d'un canal d'une faible longueur que l'on creuserait à Prerau. De cette manière la mer Noire communiquerait au moyen de bateaux d'un tonnage suffisant avec Rotterdam, Hambourg et Stettin, ainsi qu'avec les milliers de villes et de bourgs qui s'échelonnent sur les rives de ce véritable labyrinthe de canaux dont l'Allemagne et la Hollande sont sillonnées.

Le poids total des marchandises embarquées sur le Rhin en 1909 — je regrette de n'avoir pu me procurer des statistiques plus récentes — s'élève à 78 millions de tonnes; la circulation sur l'Elbe a atteint 17 millions de tonnes et le tonnage sur tout le réseau allemand s'élève à 118 millions. En Russie, le projet dont l'exécution est le plus avancé comprend la création d'un canal de Lepel à Dunabourg, qui, opérant la jonction du Dnieper à la Dvina, établira une voie navigable directe de Riga à la mer Noire. C'est là la route que suivaient les Varègues dont le commerce avec Bysance et les contrées sauvages du Nord était si florissant au X^e et au XI^e siècle. Quelle que soit l'issue de la guerre actuelle, je crois que l'on peut présumer avec certitude que tous ces canaux seront

finaleme^{nt} construits et qu'ils contribueront à étendre, au delà même de ce que nous espérons, le champ d'activité commerciale de Constantinople dont une grande partie est encore plus ou moins vierge et qui commence à peine à subir l'influence du génie moderne.

Nous devons nous rendre compte des tendances et de la direction de cette évolution. On a déjà dit que le XIX^e siècle a été le siècle de l'Amérique et que le XX^e serait celui de l'Asie. Ceci se confirmera peut-être, en partie du moins, car depuis que l'Europe dirige, une fois de plus, ses regards vers l'Orient, nous avons assisté à la construction de nombreuses voies ferrées qui suivent toutes la même direction vers l'Est; c'est d'abord le chemin de fer de Marseille, puis celui de Brindisi, puis celui de Constantinople, puis celui de Samarcande et enfin celui de Vladivostock. En outre la navigation transatlantique elle même pousse jusqu'au Levant et vient s'y établir. Vous vous souvenez peut être d'avoir vu, peu de temps avant la déclaration de la guerre, le paquebot transatlantique "Corcovado" qui est actuellement ancré dans la Corne d'Or, si je ne me trompe. Il en était à sa seconde traversée de la mer Noire à New-York lorsque la guerre éclata et l'obligea à interrompre ses voyages. Il était destiné à transporter directement les marchandises et les passagers — y compris les émigrants — embarqués en Russie, en Roumanie, en Bulgarie et en Turquie à destination de l'Amérique et qui n'y arrivaient auparavant qu'indirectement, par l'intermédiaire des divers ports de l'Europe occidentale.

L'exemple du "Corcovado" est significatif, il nous fournit la claire indication de ce qui doit fatalement arriver. L'Orient entrera en communication directe, par voie de mer, avec l'étranger, qu'il s'agisse de la Chine, de l'Australie, du Brésil ou de l'Amérique, au lieu de se contenter de fournir des clients aux grandes lignes de navigation dont le siège se trouve à Trieste, à Marseille, à Rotterdam, à Liverpool et à Hambourg.

D'autres ports du Levant, tels que Salonique et le Pirée, tireront profit de ce nouvel ordre de choses. Mais c'est Constantinople qui en retirera le plus grand avantage. Elle redeviendra une fois de plus le pivot autour duquel tout évoluera ici — le pivot d'un rouage plus vaste et plus puissant qu'il ne l'a jamais été.

Et maintenant nous voici au bout de notre excursion. Notre vision s'achève. . . . Constantinople ne redeviendra peut être jamais le centre commercial du monde; je crois cependant que nous pouvons affirmer, en nous basant sur les preuves fournies par l'histoire, que son avenir s'annonce dès à présent comme devant être extrêmement brillant. L'histoire se répète toutes les fois que les mêmes causes se produisent. Et du moment que nous aimons tous Constantinople, saluons avec joie l'ère de prospérité qui s'ouvre devant elle.

American Trade with Mesopotamia.

Cotton cloth is the most important item of import to Bagdad amounting to about \$20,000,000 in a year or nearly $\frac{1}{2}$ of the total import. About $\frac{3}{4}$ of these cotton goods are re-sold to Persia and carried by camel caravans to Kermanshah, Hamadan etc., via Khannikin.

American goods are wanted in Mesopotamia such as cotton cloth, automobiles, agricultural implements, pumps, dying and tanning material, glassware, hardware, leather, soap, matches and metals. American manufactures of this class would find an excellent market in Bagdad provided means of transportation could be obtained which would carry them reasonably direct but transshipment in European ports and again at Bombay is ruinous to American business with Mesopotamia.

In a private letter to one of the officers of the *American Chamber of Commerce for the Levant*, Mr. Oscar Stuart Heizer, American Consul in Bagdad, expressed himself as follows regarding American trade in Mesopotamia.

"If goods for Mesopotamia are to be shipped to England for transshipment to Bombay and then again transhipped to Bassorah

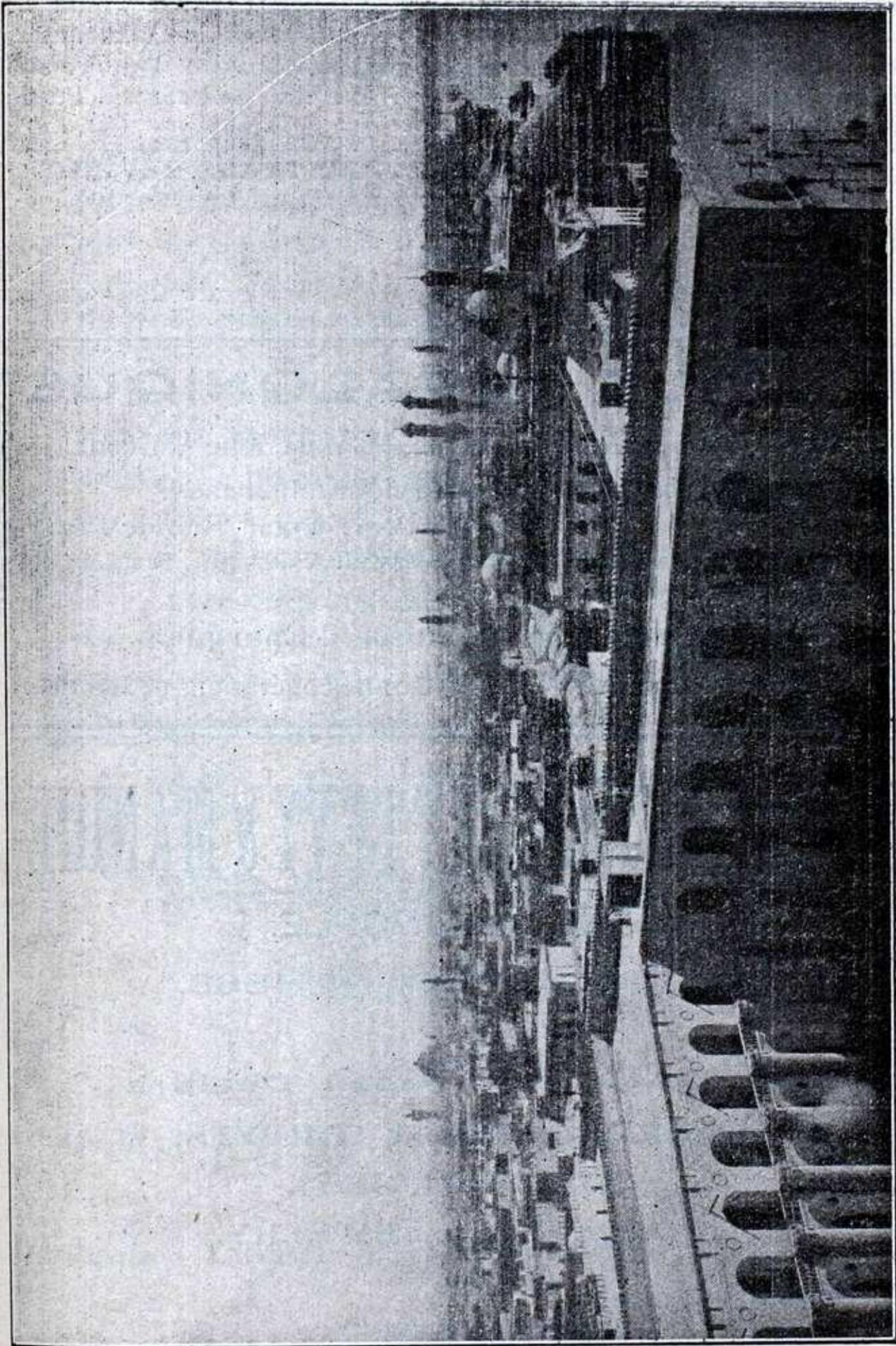

and then again loaded on to small steamers to come up the river (Tigris), there will be little business done as the best packed goods cannot stand such a trip, and the delays and expense would be prohibitive. There ought to be—must be—a direct line of steamers from New York to Bassorah which can then go on to Bombay and the Eastern ports. A big business with southern and central Persia can be done in this way.

Bulgarian Dealings

The Bulgarian harvest was abundant this year and the crops were gathered in good condition.

It is reported that the National Bank of Bulgaria intends to establish a special commercial department to operate foreign agencies on a commission basis. Import merchants and farmers who book orders with this department are to receive financial assistance from the bank.

Bulgaria needs goods of all sorts but, for the present, the Food Control permits only the free importation of the following: Cereals and flour, tanning extracts, petroleum, benzine and other mineral oils, comestibles, shoe leather, shoes, and olives. Other merchandise can be imported only with the previous authorization of the Food Control and Bureau of Foreign Exchange.

The principal articles which Bulgaria imported during the war, and which it will import again when conditions permit, are: chemical products dyes and dyestuffs, paints and varnishes, oils, fats, wax, drugs, metals, paper and paper goods, skins, leather and leather goods, textiles, railway cars, vehicles, agricultural and other machinery and implements, hardware, and jewelry.

A great part of the goods formerly supplied by Germany and Austria-Hungary can be replaced by American products, if the local tastes and customs are taken into consideration, sufficiently long credits granted, and a good transportation service established.

In normal times Bulgaria's chief export is cereals, but at present it must import flour for the needs of the urban population. Bulgaria can now export tobacco, opium, attar of roses, cocoons, and raw hides. On account of the low rate of the Bulgarian lev, it usually will be necessary for American merchants, who wish to do business immediately, to sell their goods on credit or against deposit of their value in Bulgarian money in local banks, to be paid when the ratio of exchange of the lev improves.

PROGRESS IN EGYPT.

Hon. HAMPSON GARY, Diplomatic Agent and Consul General of the United States in Cairo, has most kindly taken in hand the reorganization of the former Branch in Cairo of the *American Chamber of Commerce for the Levant*, and gratifying results have already been achieved. The further work will now devolve upon Mr. P. N. MACDONALD, General Manager for Egypt and Palestine and Syria of the Vacuum Oil Co. of Rochester, N. Y. American Investments For Turkey.

(Written for «LEVANT TRADE REVIEW»

BY W. W. CUMBERLAND, PH. D.)

That the United States is a rich country every one knows. But not every one realizes the full extent or implications of its wealth. At the present time the estimated wealth of the United States is hovering around the 300 billion dollar mark, a sum so vast that it defies the comprehension of the human mind. It can only be understood by analogy, by comparing it with the wealth of other nations. The total wealth of Great Britain is exceeded by 300 per cent, that of France by 400 or 500 per cent, that of Germany by 400 per cent, that of Turkey by 6000 per cent. In other words, the wealth of the United States is certainly equal to the combined wealth of Great Britain, France, Italy, Germany and Austria-Hungary, and Russia could probably be included for good measure.

Not only is America's wealth enormous but her income also staggers the imagination. Needless to say, not all of this income is used for current expenditures. American savings are billions and billions of dollars a year, a fact proved beyond equivocation by the sums that the Government found readily available for war purposes. In past years these national savings have been chiefly devoted to the development of the industry, agriculture and transportation of the country, particularly of the West. While that development is far from complete, while additional billions are needed for terminal facilities for railroads, for double tracking, for electrification, for irrigation and hydro-electric projects, for drainage and for roadbuilding, the facts are that the most immediate and pressing needs for capital have been satisfied. In addition, the most profitable enterprises are already under exploitation.

What is, therefore, to be done with the billions of savings that Americans are accumulating each year? Where are they to be placed? During the year just passed they have chiefly been loaned to the Government which, in return, has loaned them to European governments. Should this process be continued? The answer is distinctly «No». At the present moment the American Government has probably exceeded the bounds of prudence in its liberal granting of credits. But while the *Governments* of most of the European countries are financially unstable, the *People*, on the contrary, are as good credit risks as before the war. More important still, the lands, mines, and industrial plants of these same European countries are more valuable to-day than ever before.

The situation in Turkey offers an excellent illustration of the truth of the foregoing statements. No administration could be in worse financial straits than the Turkish, but nevertheless some investment possibilities in Turkey are distinctly favorable. In fact no one yet knows the full investment possibilities of this country, as thorough preliminary surveys are lacking in many parts. While it would doubtless be foolhardy to make important commitments before the political status of Turkey is determined, the present interval offers an admirable opportunity for conducting the work of examination and exploration that is so essential to profitable investments. Nor must it be assumed that other financial interests are neglecting the chance to be first in the field as soon as Turkey's future is assured.

Postulating a favorable government, the need for capital and the possibilities for its lucrative investment are large. The Turkish railroad system requires extension and improvement. There are mines of coal, copper and chrome to be developed, petroleum fields to be opened up, hydro-electric and irrigation works to be constructed. Manufacturing in Turkey is almost non-existent, and many lines of the rougher types of industry are quite within the range of practicability. That these demands for capital will be met is certain: the only question is: Who will furnish the capital? Will it be America or will it be countries to which America is advancing large sums? If the latter method is adopted it is true that America should hope to get interest on her advances; but if the former method is applied, America has the opportunity of becoming a direct partner in the economic life of Turkey, that is she becomes a property owner with all that is implied, instead of a mere creditor. As ordinarily the profits of properly conducted enterprises exceed the current interest rates on funds, another inducement is presented to American investors.

Much is now written and heard about the desirability of extending American trade. Few stop to think that the most certain, the most profitable and the easiest way to extend American trade is by extending American foreign investments. American owned mines or railways mean American equipment and supplies without special sales efforts being required. Moreover the trade is stable and permanent. A further advantage is that interest and dividend payments on capital invested abroad inevitably take the form of goods that flow from the borrowing to the lending country. American prestige is to-day high in the Near East. No foreign capital would be more welcome and no foreign capitalists would receive more hearty cooperation from the native population.

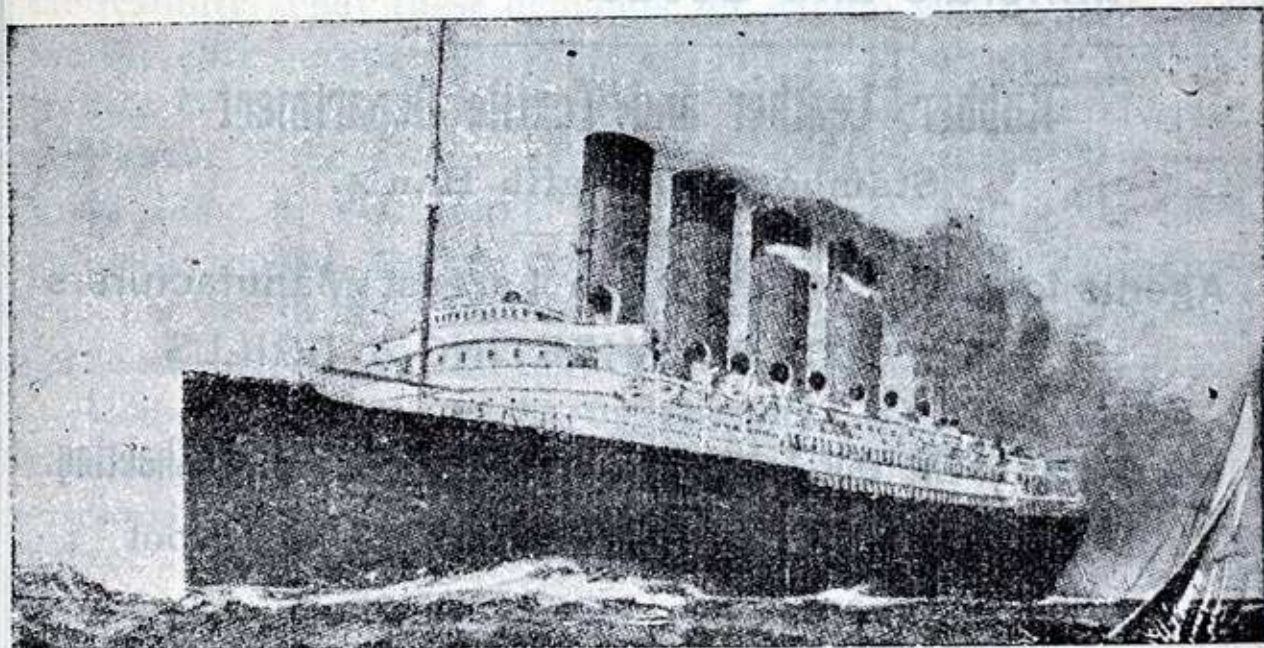

Boston to Black Sea.

Boston's steamship connections with foreign ports will soon include a line to Rumania and Black Sea ports. C. H. Sprague & Son will inaugurate such a service about November 15, and thereafter it is hoped to have regular sailings, the frequency of which will be determined by the amount of cargo offering. That New England exporters will take advantage of such a line is evident by the large amount of freight already booked for the first sailing.

A brand new steel steamer of 5,000 tons capacity will start the service. The rates are those established by Shipping Board. The cargo already booked consists of shoes, electrical machinery, agricultural implements and New England manufactured goods. It will be the first time in the history of the port that Boston ever had a line to that part of Europe.

GREEK S. S. SERVICE.

The National Steam Navigation Company of Greece has announced that regular passenger service, suspended during the war between New York and Piraeus, would be resumed in October, when the Megali Hellas, the 14,000-ton liner, would sail from New York. Inasmuch as several of the company's passenger vessels are still under requisition to the Allies, it is not known what ships will constitute the fleet, but it is anticipated that fortnightly sailings will be scheduled.

The service to Greece was suspended after October, 1917, when the Allies took over the five liners that were then operating between the United States and Piraeus. The fleet was then composed of the Themistocles, Ioanini, Athenia, Thessalonica and

the Patris. Of the five only two, the Themistocles and the Patris, escaped the hazards of war. The Ioannini was torpedoed, while the Athenia burned at sea and the Thessalonica was lost. The other two passenger ships were used by the Allies to transport troops and supplies, and as yet they have not been released. However, it is understood that they are soon to be restored to their Greek owners, and it is assumed that they will be redelivered to the National Steam Navigation Company for the American Service.

There is great interest among the Greeks in America as to when the line to Piraeus will be started anew, as there are literally thousands awaiting an opportunity to return to the old country. While some of them have taken advantage of the occasional ships that have been dispatched to Greece by the Cunard and Fabre lines, it is estimated that there are perhaps 20,000 who are biding their time and awaiting the resumption of the regular service.

The Megali Hellas was the largest passenger liner that plied between the United States and Greece, inasmuch as she could take care of 2,000 passengers. There was room for only eighty first cabin passengers and 450 second class. In the steerage more than 1,400 could be accommodated. When the war broke out, the company had building a sister ship to the Megali Hellas, which was christened the Vasilissa Sofia. She was commandeered by the British Government and put into commission in 1918 as a hospital ship. She was sent down by the Germans shortly after she was delivered.

If salvage operations that have been begun by the company on the coast of Crete are successful, however, the line will have a 20,000 gross ton passenger vessel soon. The news has

been received to the effect that the National Steam Navigation Company has purchased the former Atlantic Transport Company's liner, the *Minnehaha*. She went aground off the coast of Crete, and, while damaged somewhat, can be salvaged, according to Greek reports. At all events, the company expects to reclaim the *Minnehaha* and place her on the New York-Piræus run.

It is not known at this time how many ships the company will assign to the American service, but it is likely that there will be at least four at the outset. It requires fourteen days for the *Megali Hellas* to make the voyage from New York to Greece, but the other ships can attain the 17-knot speed of the fastest vessel.

Exhibition in Egypt.

Foreign Trade Departments in America are in receipt of a communication from Carlo Mieli of Alexandria, Egypt, stating that he is about to organize on an extensive scale, and under the protection of the United States Consul, a permanent exhibit of samples of American products and an information bureau. Manufacturers desiring to be represented should communicate with Mr. Mieli or with the United States Consul at Alexandria.

A New Foreign Trade Corporation

Capt. Edward Bickel and C. E. Knapp of Seattle, Washington, and Louis E. Timson of Lynn, Massachusetts, have formed the American Trade Corporation, with a capital of \$ 100,000, to do a general exporting and importing business. Captain Bickel sailed for the Near East October 23, with samples of American shoes and other goods. Captain Bickel

and Mr. Timson were friends in France. While in the trenches, they talked over business after the war. The new corporation developed from their planning in the trenches. Captain Bickel has been in Turkey, Palestine and Syria, making trade connections. His father, a merchant of Seattle, has sailed for Europe, to develop foreign trade. Mr. Timson is of the Charles O. Timson Shoe Company of Lynn. Mr. Knapp was a Navy Man.

AS OTHERS SEE US.

The following account is given in New York in connection with the return of the *S. S. Beatrice*.

Trade conditions at Constantinople and other ports in the Near East are unsettled, but there are indications of the revival of relations. Recently the steamer *Beatrice* returned from a number of ports in the Near East, including Constantinople, Trebizond, Smyrna and Batum, with a general cargo of figs, raisins, tobacco, nuts, hides, wool, opium, mohair and other commodities. The American Foreign Trade Corporation, which chartered the vessel, claimed that she was the first privately chartered American vessel to sail for Near Eastern ports after the signing of the armistice, and stated that she brought in the largest single tobacco shipment ever made from Samsoun, on the Black Sea.

Commenting upon conditions there, the corporation gave out the following:

"At the present time the harbor of Constantinople is jointly controlled by the English, French, and Italian naval authorities. There are no docking facilities in this city, consequently, all ships have to unload to lighters in the stream and much difficulty was experienced in the discharge of the ship, due to the crude methods in which the lighters had to be handled. Each lighter will hold from fifteen to twenty tons of

freight and is either sailed or rowed by members of its crew as there are no private tow boats in Constantinople. As the lighters are loaded from the ships they are sent to the Custom House to await their turn in passing through.

"As the military authorities have taken practically all of the water front and warehouses, the Custom House is most inadequate, hence, freight is considerably held up in delivery. There are sometimes hundreds of lighters waiting outside the quay at the Custom House to be unloaded by hand, as there are no mechanical unloading devices known in this harbor. When the lighter is finally unloaded and the commodity passed through the Custom House, it is usually after the lapse of several weeks.

"The labor situation in Constantinople is good. There is an abundance of laborers working for very moderate rates. However, they are very slow and cannot handle much over 300 tons per day from a ship. They are for the most part Greeks and Turks, although every nationality is represented. The laboring Turks wear their native costume of bright colors, with a fez always present, as this is required of all Ottoman subjects. Perhaps the most picturesque sight in any of the large Turkish ports is the Hamal. This man is the human pack horse of the country and is usually of extraordinary back strength. He is often seen carrying on his leather back saddle loads which require at least six men to place there. One frequently meets a hamal strolling along the street with a huge office desk or piano strapped on his back.

"The Turkish people desire cheap goods. They seem to prefer low prices to quality at all times.

"The farm land in the near vicinity of Constantinople is perhaps the finest in the world, but there is a woeful lack of up-to-date farm machinery. At present only the crudest methods are used in the fields, and the crops are only

about one-fifth as large as they should be with up-to-date methods.

"Building materials are practically impossible to obtain in Constantinople and the prices when the materials are procurable, are almost prohibitive. There have been fires in Constantinople which destroy from 1 to 5,000 houses at a time, as the city owns no fire fighting apparatus, and it often happens that thousands of families are left homeless and destitute by fires.

"The port of Smyrna, which is at present controlled by the Greek military authorities, is in a rather unsettled state, and not as ready to take care of business as Constantinople.

"Consensus of opinion of the Turkish public is the desire that America take over the mandate of that country, and from a commercial standpoint, it would seem that this action would be most beneficial to both countries concerned."

American Locomotives in Egypt.

(*"The Near East"*)

There seems to be a prospect that a contract will be placed by the Egyptian State Railways with an American firm for the supply of fifty locomotives. The Egyptian State Railways normally look to England for the great bulk of their locomotives and rolling stock, and the prospective loss of this contract, which will be worth at least £500,000, is naturally a matter of great concern to British firms of locomotive builders. It is maintained that British firms were not in a position to contract for the locomotives, as the time available for tenders when drawings and specification reached this country was much too short. It is stated that the contract has not been finally allotted; if so, I trust that an effort will be made to extend the time so that British firms may be allowed to participate. Our firms do not expect to be favoured at the expense of other countries, but they do expect, as they are fully entitled to, that they will be allowed to compete on equal terms with their rivals.

JUGO-SLAVIA.

The needs of our country are very big. We need homes; farming machinery, tools, all kinds of textiles, iron, steel, machinery, new railways, new roads, boats for our rivers; as a matter of fact, we need almost all manufactured products. And we would have been able, without doubt, to buy all we need with money if we had had the opportunity to sell our products for the last three years for good money, but our products and our energy of four years have been bought by our enemies. We have been forced to sell our goods for Austrian crowns, and Austria herself regulated the prices.

Ten billion crowns have been given to our nation for foodstuffs, cattle, wood, work—at a forced value of two billion dollars, and now these ten billion crowns are worth, at present rate of exchange, only \$150,000,000.

As sad as this fact is, it has something encouraging in itself. It is proof of our ability to work and produce. The products of the coming four years will not be sold for Austrian money any more, but for real money, and we will be able to overcome the difficult situation of to-day in a short time.

The only possibility to cover our urgent needs is to take loans and credits and for our further development we invite our big allies to cooperate with us in development of our natural resources. We need not only foreign capital but also the skill of the big industrial and farming countries to teach us new and better methods of producing and to share with us the results.

Our country can offer to investing parties: fertile lands, woods, best situated for exploitation, water pow-

ers, mines, full protection of property and of acquired rights, and the industrious hands of our peaceful men and women.

There are good opportunities for many kinds of manufacturing plants. We are exporting hides and importing shoes, we export fancy woods and import furniture, we export hemp and import cords, and we are exporting live pigs, and import hams.

Our country has all advantages to build up an industry—raw materials, sea coast, waterway to Constantinople, inexpensive labor wages, and a very low cost of living.

Trade with Russia.

Strongly urging economic aid to Russia and pointing out that the United States was lagging behind other countries in its effort to capture Russian trade, M. A. Oudin, vice president of the International General Electric Company, presiding at the session on Russia, told the members of the American Manufacturers' Export Association that the Russian co-operative societies afforded one means by which trade could be carried on by barter on a comprehensive, safe and sound business basis. He pointed out that Russia had surplus stocks of manganese, wheat, flax, hides, furs, etc., which could be given in exchange for such American products as tools, agricultural implements, clothing and other needed articles.

"Many nations are seeking the trade of Russia and are laying the foundation of a future trade with Russia," said Mr. Oudin. England, France and Japan have had economic commissions in Siberia. The American economic commission which was authorized by the Government in July of last year, remains to be appointed. Canada has studied the

Siberian markets and prospects. Japanese merchants, bankers and capitalists have acquired lease holdings and concessions, industries, forests and mines in Eastern Siberia.

"Germany is dominating Western Russia, and a German element is actively working in the interests of the Soviet Government, which it is well known is most favorably receptive to all German influence. The United States alone, is relatively inactive, while of all these nations it is best equipped and fitted at the present time to inaugurate commercial relations with that part of Russia not dominated by the Soviet Government, to render economic assistance to the constructive elements in Russia, and to help alleviate the intolerable miseries of the Russian people.

"Russia has offered unexampled opportunities for the investment of capital and the establishment of commercial relations. It has offered a great market for the manufactured goods of the United States. Notwithstanding the anarchy and chaos which has existed in Russia for two years and the war conditions for nearly three years prior to the Bolshevik regime, we may say with confidence that Russia will again in the future offer the same opportunities to American capital, industry and commerce that it has in the past. In order that Russia again may join the family of nations and enjoy the benefits of international intercourse, it is necessary that the official forces opposing Bolshevism be recognized and economic assistance given these elements.

"Hand in hand with the rendering of this economic assistance to the constituent Government in Russia, American business men, manufacturers and capitalists should now be laying the foundation for a great and prosperous future business with that

country. Unless America promptly responds to her own opportunities and Russia's crying needs, not only may the present disorder prevail over the greater part of Russia for an indefinite time to come, but the inactivity of America may create a prejudice against all things American, a situation which other nations, especially those contiguous to Russia, will not fail to take full advantage of."

According to "*The Near East*", London, the British Vice Consul at Rostov-on-Don, under date of September 15, reports that several of the Railway Companies and Government, Industrial and other establishments in South Russia have formed an association, with a capital of 50,000,000 roubles, for the purpose of making purchases abroad of the various machinery, railway plant, and other goods required by the subscribers. It is proposed to work the scheme on the barter principle, and as some of the members are very influential they may succeed in obtaining the necessary goods for transport. WATER ROUTES.

SOUTH RUSSIAN COMMERCE.

(„The Times”, London.)

The political convulsions through which Russia is passing have destroyed the normal course of economic life in the country and atrophied her productive powers. But in due course, from the debris of the old Empire a new Russia will rise, with potentialities for production and for the absorption of imports of manufactured goods which will afford wonderful opportunities for British merchants. When order does emerge from chaos and a vast population, impelled by necessity, becomes fully engaged in productive occupations, there need be no doubt that their output will be large enough to provide a surplus for export in exchange for goods of which the country is badly in need.

Southern Russia is a rich country, both in mineral wealth and fertility of soil. The northern district of the Don region is a great grain-producing area. To the west of the Don region is situated the Donetz coal basin, the largest in Russia, with vast

reserves of fuel. In the Grozny region are the principal petroleum wells. The region of Novorossisk was producing large quantities of cement, but the industry is at present in difficulties. Production in the iron ore and manganese industry in the Kerchensky region also has fallen to a very low level, but there are large reserves of ore. The Black Sea province is rich in unexploited forests of pine, birch, oak, walnut, and other timber, favorably situated for sea transport, and offering, when order is restored, a promising field for enterprise.

In agriculture, besides the production of cereals, the cultivation of the sunflower for its seed has become an important industry. During the prevailing scarcity of fats in Europe sunflower seed oil and oilcake have attracted attention and obtained a wide sale. The ashes obtained when the debris of the crop is burnt are a source of potash. Wide areas are admirably suited to the raising of cattle, horses, and sheep.

An official document recently issued under the authority of the South Russian Government contains some

instructive particulars of the measures taken by the Government of the region for regularizing trade relations. The Department of Trade and Industry has instituted an inquiry to ascertain the actual needs of the population, the extent of their requirements, and the articles most urgently wanted. Simultaneously, the Department has collected information concerning produce available for export. A Bureau has been established under the Department to organize sea transport, so that the available steamers may be utilized uniformly and the tonnage fairly distributed, and to maintain the ships and ports in good

condition. A Council and Commission for Foreign Trade is being created to formulate a Customs policy and decide on general principles for carrying on foreign trade. A limited liability company has been formed—the South Russian Company for Foreign Trade—with the assistance of the Government who have subscribed capital and take part in the management. The Department of Trade and Industry will guarantee contracts for the exchange of raw products. The articles of export will be leather, oil-cake, wool, potash, naphtha, and manganese ore. Manufactured goods will be imported in exchange.

IRON: The market is firm because of steady reduction of the visible supply. Foundries are making inquiries for a large tonnage for 1920 delivery. Quotations on October 2 remained at \$30.80 and \$32.80 for No IX foundry and \$30.30 and 31.80 for 2X foundry.

COFFEE: Fancy coffees are reported scarce and practically unobtainable. Mild coffees are being offered at big reductions below Santos grades. Santos 4's were quoted on October 2 at 25 $\frac{1}{4}$ cents and Santos 3's at 27 cents. Rio 7's were quoted at 15 and 15 $\frac{1}{4}$ cents. Nominal quotations on mild grades were: Maracaibo, 22 $\frac{1}{2}$ and 24 cents: washed, 25 $\frac{1}{2}$ and 26 $\frac{1}{2}$

cents: Bogota, common, 20 and 21 cents; fancy, 27 $\frac{1}{2}$ cents; Bucaramanga, 23 and 25 $\frac{1}{2}$ cents: washed, 27 and 27 $\frac{1}{2}$ cents; Costa Rica, 20 and 21 cents, prime to choice, 26 $\frac{1}{4}$ and 27 $\frac{1}{2}$ cents;

SUGAR: The situation remains acute because of the shortage, which has seriously affected the canning season. The fixed price for raw sugars remains at 7.26.

COCOA: The market continues quiet and very firm. Quotations on October 2 were: Accra, 21 and 21 $\frac{1}{2}$ cents: Bahia 21 $\frac{1}{4}$ and 23 $\frac{1}{2}$ cents; Arriba, 25 and 27 cents; Machalo, 23 $\frac{1}{2}$ and 24 cents; Sanchez, 20 and 21 cents.

WHEAT: New York official prices are: No 1 northern spring, \$2 39; No 2 red, \$2.26 $\frac{1}{2}$.

CORN: The cash market is firm and the undertone of the future market is steady. No 3 yellow was quoted in New York on October 2 at \$1.60 $\frac{1}{2}$.

CRUDE RUBBER: The market is steady, manufacturers showing little interest and offerings continuing restricted. Quotations on October 2 were: Up-river, fine, 54 $\frac{3}{4}$ and 55 cents; Centrals, 25 and 27 cents.

HIDES: On October 1 fully 35,000 Bogotas, Orinocas and other dry hide varieties were sold on a basis of 48 cents. This purchase, the most important in several weeks, was interpreted as indicative of a buying movement. Little business is being done in imported wet salted hides. Quotations on October 2 were: Bogotas, 48 cents; Orinocas, 48 cents; Central Americas, 47 and 49 cents.

GOAT SKINS: Prices are more or less nominal and tending to go lower. Quotations on October 2 were; Oaxaca, first selection, \$1.50; Brazil, first selection, \$2.10 and \$2.20; Payta, \$1.05.

COTTON: The Department of Agriculture report of October 2 placed

the condition of the crop as of September 25 at 54.4 per cent. of a normal, compared with 61.4 per cent. on August 5 last, and with 63.5 per cent., the average on September 25 of the last ten years. The first effect of the report was a break of 40 points, after which the market became erratic. December cotton sold off to 31.50 cents, or a break of about 72 points following the report, and about 56 points under the close of the preceding day.

LEAD: The market is quiet, both the leading interests and outsiders quoting a nominal price of 6.25 cents per pound, New York.

SPELTER: The price for East St. Louis, spot shipment, on October 2 was reported as around 6.95 cents. On forward delivery the price ranged up to 7.05 cents for late October.

ALUMINUM: Virgin metal continues to be quoted at 33 cent a pound.
