Trade Openings in Greece

The following is taken from the report of a recent interview of Eliot G. Mears, former United States Trade Commissioner in the Levant, by a representative of the New-York Journal of Commerce :

Greece, as a result of population and territorial increase, along with greatly enlarged wealth and post-war readjustment demands, is to-day a land of exceptional trade opportunities for the United States. Such is the opinion as expressed to The Journal of Commerce representative by Eliot G. Mears, who has recently returned from the Levant, where for several years he has been United States Trade Commissioner attached to the Athens and Constantinople embassies. Mr. Mears was also a member of the recent Harbord Mission to the Caucasus.

American business men will be interested to know, said Mr. Mears, that currency and banking conditions in Greece are probably on a sounder basis than those of any other Eastern European country. She is in a position where she can not only buy what she wants but can, to a large extent, pay cash. Unlike other countries, she does not stand in need of special credit accommodations. Despite her heavy marine losses in the war, she really increased her aggregate wealth. Her shipping is

almost back to a normal basis, having increased from about 400,000 tons to 750,000 tons since the war.

Greek resources were greatly enlarged by the terms of the treaty with Turkey signed a few weeks ago, which assure to Greece Bulgarian Macedonia, Western and Eastern Thrace, together with certain of the Dodecanese Islands. Also Greece is assigned administrative jurisdiction for at least five years over the rich Smyrna section where the sovereignty of Turkey is now merely nominal.

These accessions, which increase the population to 8,000,000, bring to Greece some of the finest tobacco lands in the world, the source of virtually all the famous Turkish tobaccos. They also include regions well known for other products such as nuts, dried fruits, skins and certain minerals.

The chief ports of the new Greece, which the Greeks are striving to make the pivotal points of the Mediterranean trade are Piraeus, Saloniki and Patras. Large foreign shipments to Greece are most economically handled when directed to these ports, from which small vessels operating with great frequency distribute the goods to other points as desired.

From the American point of view the outstanding business attractions in Greece are in connection with the following: Agricultural development, port and harbor improvement, rail-

roads, municipal utilities and hydro-electric enterprise.

There is a good market in Greece for agricultural machinery of all kinds but especially of the sort practicable for small farms. Greece, like others of the Eastern States, is experiencing a radical breaking up of her larger estates and she seems destined to become a country of small but fertile and prosperous farms.

A very ambitious programme of port and harbor improvement has been mapped out. Large expenditures are soon to be made in providing the ports, especially that of Piraeus, with modern dock facilities of all kinds. The Government has already arranged to spend \$25,000,000 on the harbor of Piraeus alone. Three British firms are at present bidding for the job, which will most probably be awarded to an Englishman.

The Greek government also plans

a large-scale overhauling and extension of its railway systems. To the State lines were recently added the French roads through Macedonia. Railway equipment in large quantities will no doubt be marketed in Greece in the near future.

Lack of fuel has led to the determination to develop to the limit the water power in Greece. In the neighborhoods of Vodena and Verria water energy to the amount of 55,000 horse power now going to waste will soon be harnessed. This enterprise is regarded as particularly important because of its proximity to many textile factories and mineral deposits, notably lignite.

Although, as compared with American standards, municipal utilities in Greece are somewhat backward, the rapidly growing population and wealth of the cities, together with the renewed progressiveness of spirit, are expected to work wonders in the near future.



The chief products of Greece, from which her exports are mainly drawn, are tobacco, currents, skins (goat, sheep and kid), opium and minerals such as emery, magnesite and lignite.

As a result of the heavy inward movement of goods, which was typical of all European sea-coast countries after the war, Greek markets are now pretty well stocked, says Mr. Mears, so far as general merchandise is concerned. This condition cannot long continue, however. Normally, Greece buys and will continue to buy largely of such things as cereals, sugar, coffee, agricultural implements, textiles, shoes, paper and products, furniture, chemicals, marine engines, and small motors generally. The British Army supplies at Saloniki were recently sold to the Greeks. They included fairly large supplies of agricultural and railway equipment and motor trucks.

Greek merchants are not confined within the borders of their own country, says Mr. Mears, but are the most conspicuous dealers throughout the whole of the Levant. They are to be found in large numbers in every sea-coast town of the Mediterranean, the Aegean, and the Black Seas, and therefore connections with them would insure business over a wide field.

Mr. Mears does not advise as a general policy the practice of resorting to consignments in exporting to the Levant. He regards as entirely feasible that the exporter should insist on cash against documents at time of delivery, or else require the necessary amount of confirmed credit in New York. This policy is not advocated out of considerations of the risk involved in long time credit transactions, but because of any lack of necessity for such credits. Greece in particular he regards as amply able to finance her trade require-

ments either on a cash basis or on a well secured short term credit basis.

As one of the many evidences of this, Mr. Mears pointed to the fact that the Greeks in America transmitted to their country according to the figures of Greek bankers, the sum of 350,000,000 drachmas (drachma, 19 $\frac{1}{2}$ cents) annually, an amount in itself larger than the Greek imports of merchandise.

DOCUMENTS Required by American Customs Officials

A circular from the Foreign Trade Department of the American Express Company of New York City has reached the Bureau of the Chamber. It states in a concise and practical manner for assistance to exporters from foreign countries the requirements of American Customs with regard to documents on shipments of goods. In recommending its own service it gives the warning, which also may be taken in general with reference to merchandise sent to any consignee in America, that, if an effort is made by the shipper to see that papers are complete and in proper form, and that they are forwarded at the same time with the shipment, it will facilitate the service of the consignee and render it more efficient,

and will also prevent the merchandise from being placed in "general order" (U. S. bonded warehouse) by the United States Officials, which usually means additional storage charges and unnecessary delays and annoyances to all concerned.

Each shipment or consignment should be accompanied by the following papers :

1. Bills of Lading (Two Copies)
2. Insurance Policies

The shipper should take care that his merchandise is properly insured not only against marine dangers, but against war risks, particular average, theft, pilferage, and breakage, as the case may require. He should inspect the policy carefully to see that all the coverage he has requested is provided.

Whenever possible the "Warehouse to Warehouse" clause should be included in the insurance policy. This clause protects against loss by fire,

flood and rising waters, from consignor's warehouse and also supplies necessary protection while on the steamer dock or until placed in storage or delivered to consignee after arrival at destination.

3. Consular invoice (Two Copies)

This invoice should give the following information :

a) A true description of the merchandise, using its trade name in the country of exportation.

b) The true market value at time of shipment in wholesale quantities at the principal market nearest the port of shipment.

c) All shipping costs such as freight commission, insurance, etc., should be listed separately on the Consular Invoice.

d) The Consular Invoice should be certified by the United States Consul if the value of goods shipped is over \$100.00.

e) There are two forms of "Shipper's Declaration" appearing on the back of the Consular Invoice to be filled in by the shipper as the case requires. The first is for merchandise already sold, the second for merchandise to be consigned.

There are other documents required in particular cases as outlined below :

4. Certificate of Depreciated Currency

When shipments are subject to United States import duty and when these shipments are from countries in which the exchange value of the local currency is below par value as compared to the American Dollar, a "Certificate of Depreciated Currency" will save shipper a considerable amount of duty charges.

The nearest United States Consul or the Consulate in charge of United States affairs will on this paper certify to the current rate of the local money prevailing at the time ship-

ment is made and this certificate enables the consignee to pay duty on the actual exchange value of that currency instead of the par value. Shippers will appreciate the importance of this document.

5. Sanitary Certificates

Agricultural products such as nursery stock, trees, plants, bulbs, seeds, etc., usually require a certificate from the Inspector at the United States Consul's office, stating where the merchandise was grown and that it is free from all injurious insects, pests, disease, etc.

Animal products such as hides, skins, wool, etc., require a United States Consular Certificate similar to the above, showing that the merchandise has been properly disinfected and that it comes from a district where no animal diseases exist. This document may also be obtained from the Inspector at the nearest United States Consul's office.

6. Purity Certificate

Food or drug products require a certificate from the manufacturer or shipper showing quality and quantity and whether or not the goods contain preservatives or adulterants.

General Suggestions

Marking the Shipment

Manufactured goods ready to be sold to the consumer must bear a plain stamp or mark that will not wear off in transit, to show the country of origin.

Packing Lists

The shipper should show on this list exactly how many pieces are included in each case, bag or other container; of what quality the goods in each container are, and the marks on each one. It is most important that goods be packed securely for export, if it is expected to have them arrive in good condition at destination.

Private Invoices and Advices

An invoice giving complete and detailed information and showing exactly what value is placed on the goods by the consignor, should also be included with the above papers. At the time a shipment is sent, shipper should write to consignee all the instructions that are needed to proceed with the transaction when the goods arrive. This is very important.

Les associations en question expliquent fort clairement comment il est possible de payer, grâce aux avances de fonds, les différents frais occasionnés par la construction d'une maison ; de régler, par exemple, les factures de l'architecte, de l'entrepreneur de maçonnerie, des décorateurs, etc.

Le coût exorbitant de la main-d'œuvre et de certains matériaux tels que la brique, a fortement encouragé la construction de maisons en ciment ou en béton. Les bâtiments modernes peuvent être entièrement composés de ciment : murs, planchers, etc., le tout fini avec le plus grand soin et peint en différentes nuances.

La maison modèle, telle qu'elle était exposée dans le hall du "Grand Central Palace" comprenait trois pièces entièrement construites en ciment : la salle à manger, la cuisine et l'office. Les murs extérieurs étaient en ciment : l'intérieur en était peint en différentes

couleurs aussi jolies que les peintures exécutées sur plâtre ; les planchers, également en ciment, étaient aussi lisses que le plus beau carrelage. Les cloisons de séparation entre les chambres étaient formées de panneaux spéciaux d'environ un centimètre d'épaisseur, posés les uns sur les autres par couches isolées au moyen de papier imperméable. Ces panneaux, qui sont fournis en sections de quatre pieds de largeur et en n'importe quelle longueur n'excédant pas 10 pieds, forment, lorsqu'ils sont posés, des parois lisses sur lesquelles on peut coller directement le papier peint ou peindre à même les décos murales. Railways in the Red Sea Region

(From report of American Consul Southard, Aden)

The Aden, Red Sea, commercial district, which includes the Arabian Red Sea Provinces of lower Hedjaz, Asir, and Yemen, and Gulf of Aden territory, on the Asiatic side, and Eritrea, Abyssinia, and the Somalilands, on the African side, is very poor in railways. The approximate area of

this district is 850,000 square miles, and the population is estimated at from 12,000,000 to 15,000,000. The entire territory has considerably less than a thousand miles of railways.

Franco-Ethiopian Railway.

The railway which runs from Jibuti on the Gulf of Aden, to Adis Abeba, the capital of Abyssinia, is the oldest and longest in the district. It was begun in 1897, but was not completed until 1916. The engineering difficulties encountered were not great, but the financing of the project caused the long delay in its completion. According to figures available, the steepest gradient is 1 in 140, and its sharpest curve 164 yards radius. The length of this railroad is about 487½ miles, nearly one-half of which is through desert or semi-desert country. Some-what less than the last half passes through fertile country of considerable agricultural and grazing value. The trip from Jibuti to Adis Abeba is made in three one-day stages.

The Franco-Ethiopian Railway is of metre gauge (39.37 inches). The ties or sleepers are of steel and, together with the rolling stock, are of French make. The locomotives and passenger coaches are small and most of the freight wagons are of from 10 to 20 metric tons capacity. Open wagons are much used for the moving of freight on the Jibuti half of the road, as there is very little rainfall. Coal and wood are used for fuel. The present equipment is old, and much of it will soon need to be replaced. The operating company is known as the Compagnie du Chemin de fer Franco-Ethiopian.

Massowah-Asmara Railway.

The second railway built in this district was the one running from the Red Sea port of Massowah to Asmara, on the plateau of the Italian colony of Eritrea, a distance of about 80 miles. It was begun in 1900 by military

forces of the Italian Government, and was completed in 1911. Beginning on the coastal plain, it runs for some miles through desert country, then rising through the rocky and semi-barren foothills to the mountains of the main plateau, which it ascends to Asmara, the capital of the colony, about 7,500 feet above sea level. Considerable engineering difficulties attended the building of this 90-centimetre gauge (35.43 inches) railway. From the foothills the gradient is, for most of the way, 1 : 28 or 1 : 29. There are a number of sharp curves, bridges, viaducts, and tunnels. There are in all 29 tunnels, of which the longest is nearly 900 yards in length. The journey by train is made in six hours, and some remarkable scenic effects are offered.

A project for building a railway distance under 300 miles, from the port of Assab across the waterless Danakil desert to the productive Abyssinian plateau near Dessie has been

considered by the Italian Colonial government. This would be less expensive, and would incidentally open a potentially very rich commercial field which would offer skins, hides, and other raw products for export, and would take considerable quantities of general hardware and kerosene, and of such simple manufactures as unbleached cotton piece goods and yarn.

There has also been considered the extension of the Franco-Ethiopian Railway, by French interests, from Adis Abeba southwest to Gambela on the Sobat River, a distance of about 400 miles. Here there is in the rainy season steamboat connection with Khartoum via the Sobat and White Nile Rivers, a distance of about 900 miles. This road would open up very rich and important commercial territory, but the approximately 400-mile route across mountainous country would make construction expensive

and entail considerable engineering difficulties.

Other railway schemes for opening up the rich territory of Abyssinia are roads from Adis Abeba south through Italian Somaliland to the Indian Ocean port of Isala in that territory (by Italian interests), and from Dire-Dawa, a station on the present Franco-Ethiopian Railway, to Harrar in Abyssinia (by French interests), with a possible extension eastward to the port of Zeila in British Somaliland (by British interests). This latter scheme will possibly be the first to receive active or definite consideration.

On the Asiatic side of the Red Sea there is the projected railway from the port of Hodeida to Sanaa, the capital of Yemen Province. Several years ago this railway was actually surveyed and construction begun by a syndicate formed in Paris. Five or six miles of single metre gauge track were put down and some thousands of tons of

material for further construction landed near Hodeida. The war between Italy and Turkey in 1912 interfered; and the European war, following shortly, prevented further progress. The material lies rusting on the beach. When the political status of the Arabian Red Sea coast has been decided, and conditions approach normal, it is possible that this important project will be revived, presumably by British interests. For the remaining distance of approximately 100 miles to Sanaa it would have to be built through the foothills and difficult mountains, rising to Sanaa, on the Yemen Plateau, some 7,000 or 8,000 feet above sea level. Such a road would open up a very rich, well-watered, inland plateau, which could feed the desert coastal plains with its agricultural products, and which would offer greatly increased supplies of the famous Mocha coffee, skins, hides, and other raw products for export to world markets through the port of Hodeida.

This road is owned and operated by the government of the Italian colony of Eritrea. It is well ballasted, and the ties or sleepers are steel. The equipment is well taken care of, but has been in use for some years, and much of it will soon need replacement. Coal is the usual fuel, but owing to its shortage wood has been used to some extent.

Railway to Abyssinian Potash Mine.

From the little Red Sea port of Mersa Fatimari, about 70 miles south of the port of Massowah, there has been built a light narrowgauge railway of the Decauville type. This road has a length of about 46 miles over desert country and reaches the Abyssinian frontier. It was built, and is used, for the hauling of potash salts from a deposit which is in the Asale salt plains, about 10 miles beyond the terminus. Originally small steam locomotives were used, but owing to the scarcity of water this was found to be very expensive and almost impractical.

Motor trucks were fitted to the rails, and about 16 of them are now used by the company working the potash deposits. This company is known as the Societa Mineraria Coloniale. The potash railway runs over desert plains, and no engineering difficulties had to be overcome in constructing it. Keeping the tracks clear of drifting sands is sometimes a problem during the seasons when the hot winds are strongest.

Aden-Lahej Railway.

The Aden-Lahej Railway was begun in 1915 by British military forces operating from Aden against Turkish forces on the Arabian mainland. It was built through to Lahej, about 25 miles from Aden, in 1918-19, and has now been extended a few miles beyond that desert oasis. The gauge is 1 metre (39.37 inches). The equipment was originally used on the Bombay, Baroda & Central India Railway in British India ; it is old and must soon be replaced to insure efficient operation. This is a Government-

owned military road, but when not required for military use is available for the transportation of commercial products.

Lines Projected or Being Constructed.

In addition to those already discussed, there is nearing completion a railway from Asmara to Keren in the Italian colony of Eritrea. It runs north from Asmara, a distance of 105 kilometres (65.24 miles), and may be opened for traffic during the present year. Its purpose is to connect the Red Sea port of Massowah, via Asmara, with the commercial caravan routes converging on Keren from the Sudan and the potentially rich Barca River district of Eritrea.

Italian railways are proposed from Asmara south via Adi Caieh, or Adi Quala, into Abyssinia; and from Keren via Agordat, Elaghim, and Gondar, in Abyssinia, to Adis Abeba; but their actual construction is still a matter for

future consideration. They will be important in the opening up of the very rich districts of the Abyssinian Eritrean Plateau, which is well watered and fertile, and there would seem to be no doubt as to their eventual construction.

Beaucoup de ces difficultés seraient évitées avec facilité, si l'acheteur étranger avait pris plus de précautions en établissant ses rapports commerciaux pour les marchandises américaines. C'est plutôt une illusion que de croire ou d'espérer, que des marchandises de toute première qualité peuvent toujours être obtenues de toutes les maisons engagées dans le commerce des cuirs ou des chaussures, aussi bien en Amérique que dans n'importe quel autre. Il y a pourtant des moyens qui sont offerts pour connaître le caractère de l'établissement avec lequel on désire d'entrer en relations commerciales. Par exemple, la rédaction de cette publication a des années d'expérience pratique en ce qui concerne l'industrie des cuirs et des chaussures et se fait un point, de mettre en rapport l'acheteur avec le vendeur. Tout manufacturier américain de cuirs ou de chaussures, toute compagnie ou exportateur qui profite de sa situation pour imposer une qualité inférieure sur un marché étranger, signe son arrêt de mort comme exportateur. Mais de plus, il rend plus difficile l'exercice du commerce à son voisin, qui a aspiré à établir et à maintenir sa position d'exportateur.

Il existe quelques publications américaines, qui, à certaines périodes de l'année, éditent un numéro spécial dit "d'exportation" qui est envoyé à l'étranger par centaines et même par milliers d'exemplaires ; mais, ces publications ne sont pas exclusivement des journaux de commerce d'exportation. Ce n'est qu'une affaire d'"à côté" qui leur facilite d'obtention de ce qu'on appelle "easy money" (argent facile). Ces publications contiennent certainement un petit nombre d'annonces qui sont insérées pour leur valeur au point de vue de l'exportation, mais elles contiennent surtout un plus grand

nombre d'informations qui n'ont jamais été destinées au commerce d'exportation. Quelque acheteur étranger, peut écrire, se basant sur les annonces insérées, à un certain nombre de maisons américaines, qui ne sont nullement préparées pour le commerce d'exportation et qui, dans leur ignorance de ce commerce spécial, ne peuvent proprement servir le client d'outre-mer en lui envoyant ce qu'il désire où ce qu'il devrait avoir ; qui, en d'autres termes, ne peuvent accorder à leur client ce que l'on appelle ici un "Square deal."

D'autre part, il existe des publications qui sont entièrement dévouées au commerce d'exportation. "The Boot and Shoe Recorder" qui possède une organisation complète et entièrement séparée pour la conduite de son commerce étranger. Cette section publie une édition espagnole en même temps que celle-ci, en français.

Rien, dans cette section, n'est toléré ou même traité avec un semblant même de négligence qui ne soit absolument en faveur de l'acheteur étranger et qui ne lui donne la plus grande somme de satisfaction dans ses affaires.

Malheureusement, il y a environ une année, quelques personnes dans ce pays, ne connaissant rien sur les cuirs, s'établirent marchands de ces produits simplement au point de vue spéculatif. Ils achetaient leurs marchandises aux tanneurs ou aux commissionnaires et les revendaient partout où ils trouvaient acquéreurs, profitant des conditions offertes par un marché continuellement en hausse. Leur seul objet, était de convertir leurs marchandises en argent comptant et de se débarrasser de tout ce qu'ils avaient en mains ; mais, depuis la période de tranquillité subie par le marché, la plupart de ces nouveaux venus ont disparu du commerce.

Il y aurait beaucoup à dire sur ce sujet qui est loin d'être nouveau, et nous ne pouvons que suggérer à l'a-

Turkish Fruit Crops

Messrs. C. J. Giraud and Co., Smyrna, report to "The Near East" as follows for August :

Sultanas.—With the cessation of hostilities during the past few weeks it is now possible to communicate more freely with the fruit-growing districts and to obtain comprehensive information about the general prospects of the vineyards. Owing to the unsettled conditions which have prevailed throughout the province since last autumn, it is now becoming evident that the vines in many districts did not receive the attention which was necessary to assure the bearing of a

full yield. Reports reaching us from our agents in the principal growing districts are to the effect that the yield is likely to prove below earlier estimates, and it is anticipated that the final result will not exceed 20-22,000 tons. On the other hand, the grapes are in sound condition and of exceptionally good development. Weather prevailing is favourable and if no rains fall during the next month, the fruit will be cut under satisfactory conditions, and the run of qualities should in such case prove superior to last season. The supply of inferior grades is likely to be small. Arrivals of new fruit to date amount to about 500 sacks, say 70 tons, which have been promptly taken up day by day at prices ranging from 105s. to 125s. cost and freight, mainly for sample purposes. Arrivals from all districts will not become general for at least another fortnight. The small lots of fruit that have so far come forward show exceedingly well as regards quality.



Red Raisins.—Prospects are unchanged and point to a reduced production. No prices have yet been named for forward delivery. This fruit will only be available for shipment towards end of September or early October.

Black Raisins.—We have nothing to add to the forecast made in our previous report. As in the case of red raisins, this fruit will not be available for shipment before the early part of October.

Figs.—Outlook is in all ways satisfactory. Practically the whole of the Meander Valley, which is the centre of the fig production, is now under control of the Greek military authorities, and arrangements have been made by the Ottoman Railway Company for the quick transport of the fruit to market. First arrivals are expected in the early part of next week. The crop is estimated at anything between 80-85,000 loads, and the fruit, owing to the favourable and dry weather which has prevailed, gives promise of exceptional soundness.

General Remarks.—The military operations undertaken by the Greek Army during the past three months have necessitated the requisitioning of a large number of camels and carts in all districts for transport purposes. Complaints are now general of the want of sufficient transport for the moving of the crops, and owing to these considerations some fears are entertained that arrivals may not immediately come forward in the volume which under ordinary conditions we should expect.

As regards prices, buyers abroad are exercising considerable prudence, and have displayed little anxiety so far to operate for forward shipment either on sultanas or figs. If this policy is persevered in, our market will have to conform to the ideas of consumers abroad. Last year both sultanas and figs were under control,

and owing to the heavy purchases effected by the British Ministry of Food, about 20,000 tons of sultanas and 10,000 tons of figs were rushed forward between September 1 and the end of October. Control was removed on the 2nd of this month, and it is unlikely that such heavy shipments as were effected last season in the course of two months can possibly go forward in the present campaign. Shippers will doubtless exercise some caution in the extent of their consignments, and unless encouraged by satisfactory and prompt sales abroad, will have little inducement to force large consignments on unresponsive markets.

So far as figs are concerned, American buyers, as a rule, were accustomed to operate on a large scale in advance of the season, but owing to the disastrous results of their purchases last year, are working very cautiously this season. Owing to their reserve they have been successful in forcing

down prices to an unexpectedly low level. The extent of orders, moreover, which they have placed on our market is very much smaller than usual, and in view of the promising crop it is certain that prices will have to rule at a low and attractive level to stimulate consumption abroad, and to permit of the disposal of our crop on foreign markets.

First shipments of the season are advertised for early in September.

Corinth Canal Company has Adopted Suez Canal Rules

On April 14, 1920, the Nouvelle Société du Canal de Corinthe began to apply the Suez Canal tonnage rules to vessels of all kinds passing through the Corinth Canal. The company has emphasized especially the importance of a paragraph of article 14 of the Suez Canal Rules touching deductions. The article, which provides for deductions in charging tolls, is as follows :

The spaces occupied by the engines, boilers, coal bunkers, shaft trunks of screw steamers, and the spaces between decks and in the covered and closed - in erections on the upper deck surrounding the funnels, and required for the introduction of air and light into the engine rooms, and for the proper washing of the engines themselves.

Such deductions can not exceed 50 per cent of the gross tonnage.

Notes from Crete

The principal ports of Crete are on the north of the island, Rethymno, Candia, and Canea, looking towards the Aegean, and more recently developing direct and closer connection with Athens or the Piraeus, where Cretan merchants are generally represented. However, the importance in quantity of certain of its products of high quality brings the island frequent visits of foreign steamers for more distant trade.

Among the chief products of the island are olive oil, valonea, wine, raisins, almonds, citrates, and locust beans, and silk, wool, cheese and soap in a certain area of the island. Its imports are grain, flour, groceries, dry goods, iron, fish, and bags and lumber for crates, etc. for its products. A few automobiles have come to the island and the American machines have found a place with the European cars. So far the market has not been large owing to the condition of the roads. It is anticipated that cars for transportation will soon be demanded, but not of the higher-priced make.

The harvests of 1920 have not been altogether satisfactory largely on account of the unseasonable rains; al-

monds and citrates especially have been affected, but the yield of raisins and locust beans is not large ; olive oil is estimated at 40-50,000,000 okes (1 oke, 2.8 lb.) ; valonea at 500,000 quintals (1 quintal, about 2 cwt.)

Serbian Carpet Wools Exported to United States.

(*Consul K. S. Patton, Belgrade*)

In Serbia wool is not graded, but is classified according to the names of the principal regions in which it is grown. The principal wool-growing regions are Pirot, Cjenica, and Southern Serbia, and the wool is designated under these names. In Bosnia and Herzegovina, the wool is known as Zackel wool, and that from Montenegro is simply known under the name of that country. The difference in quality is a direct result of the climate, the colder mountain regions furnishing a longer, heavier wool than that grown in the lower, warmer regions. These classes are invariably sold as washed or unwashed. The washing only eliminates the superficial dirt, in no sense eradicating the grease.

After the wool is clipped, it is superficially washed and roughly packed in bags ; then peasants sell it to the dealers in the neighboring villages, who, in turn, sell it to merchants in the larger adjoining town. In this way the wool is concentrated in the more important market centers of the country, though it passes through five or six dealers before it ultimately reaches the manufacturers or exporters. Practically all of the wool for foreign commerce went to Bohemia and Austria before the war. The Bohemian and Austrian importers had traveling agents to collect the wool throughout the country, the individual lots being invariably small.

Forest Resources of Transylvania

The Transylvanian territories awarded to Roumania by the Peace Treaty are rich in forest wealth, and plans are already being formed for the exploitation of these resources. According to the Hungarian statistics of 1917 the total forest area of Transylvania is 10,179,907 acres. Thickly forested areas cover 84 per cent of the total forest area.

With regard to varieties of trees, 5,429,590 acres, or 53 per cent of the total forest area, are covered with deciduous trees : oak trees cover 24 per cent, and trees of the pine family the remaining 23 per cent of the forested area.

Out of the total forest area of 10,179,907 acres, 7,033,127 acres are the property of the State and the communes and 3,146,780 acres the property of timber companies and other private parties.

Apart from the forests in the Transylvania territories recently acquired by Roumania, there are forests in the Old Kingdom which cover an area of 6,525,740 acres, thus making the total forest area in Transylvania and Old Roumania equal to 16,705,647 acres.

BULGARIA**Markets for American Agricultural Machinery***(From report of Acting Consul Wadsworth, Sofia)***I. Agriculture in Bulgaria, General Considerations.**

I. Climate and Soil. The climate of Bulgaria is a continental one, the mean difference between the highest and the lowest monthly temperatures (those for July and for January, respectively) being about 68 degrees Fahrenheit. The mean annual temperature is 50 degrees Fahrenheit. The rainy season corresponds to that of Eastern European countries and there is a sufficiency of rain during the other seasons. The average annual rainfall is about 28 inches. The predominant westerly and north-westerly winds reach Bulgaria cold and extract of the greater part of their moisture and the north-easterly winds from the Black Sea keep the temperature low. On the whole, however, the winters are but moderately cold, the summers neither excessively dry nor hot and the spring and summer season excellent for the growth of products common to a temperate climate. The soil of Bulgaria, consisting chiefly of "Black" loam and clay, found generally throughout all sections of the country is excellent and, although the average peasant farmer pays little attention to the modern principles of the rotation of crops, fertilisation, etc., the yield is good and, thanks to gradually improving methods and the increasing literacy of the rural population, promises to show annual increased in both quantity and quality.

II. Bulgarian Farms and Agricultural Products

1. Farms. As already stated above, the characteristic trait of Bulgarian land tenure is the system of small holdings. Bulgaria is frequently called the "Peasant State of the Balkans" and this statement is largely borne out by the following table showing the size and number of its average farms :

2. Products. Of all the arable land in Bulgaria actually under cultivation approximately three-fourths is devoted to various cereals. The other one-fourth is devoted to vineyards, rose gardens, orchards and meadows and to

the cultivation of tobacco, rice, hemp and rape, beetroot, vegetables and other culinary and oleaginous plants, and of this one-fourth some 70% is meadow land. Bulgaria is able, therefore, to export not only large quantities of cereals but considerable quantities of tobacco as well. The rose is cultivated for the production of the famous Bulgarian attar of rose, practically the entire product being exported.

3. Cereals. From the foregoing, it is evident that the production of cereals is, by far, the most important factor in the economic life of Bulgaria. The following table indicates, in round numbers, the amounts of the various kinds of cereals produced in and exported from Bulgaria during the years 1908 and 1912, as published by the Ministry of Agriculture; reliable figures for later years are unobtainable and, even were such figures procurable, the effects of the abnormal conditions existing in the Balkans during the past years would render them of little value for comparative purposes.

The harvest of 1919 is given as approximately 3,780,000 tons. Practically no exportation of cereals was made during that year. The harvest of 1920 promises to be considerably larger and of better quality than that of last year. Official estimates put the surplus of this year's harvest, available for export, at about 1,500,000 tons.

III. American farm machinery for Bulgaria.

1. General Considerations. The enactment of the Bulgarian Government rendering public instruction obligatory extends to all children between the ages of six and fourteen. The present generation in the rural districts has, therefore, a fair education which permits the disseminating of the information which a seed catalogue, properly illustrated, should contain. Such catalogues should be printed in the Bulgarian language. The dealers in agricultural machinery speak German and some French in addition to their own tongue. It cannot be said, however, that the peasant is adapting himself to the use of agricultural machinery. He still does about 90% of the farm work by hand, and as the farm lands are generally at some distance from the village in which he lives,

he takes the necessary tools to his fields and works there until he has finished living on one field after another, frequently during several weeks at a time.

2. Tools and Machinery. The tools in common use to-day are of the simplest kind; the plows are mostly of the old wooden type and very few harrows are used. The grass-hook and cycle are used for harvesting and the scythe for cutting grass, and, this year, 1920, the harvest was almost entirely cut by hand. The following table shows, in round numbers, the number of ploughs and agricultural machines in use in the years 1902, 1914 and 1915, as officially published by the Bulgarian Ministry of Agriculture.

3. Market Conditions. As the average Bulgarian farm is small (ses II, 1, above) and is frequently divided into two or more parts separated one from another by distances of as much as four or five miles, Bulgaria can use only the small lines of farm machinery used in the United States, such as small harvesters and binders, reapers, mowers and tillage tools.

The question of the introduction of the American farm tractor has until very recently been little considered by even the more enlightened agricultural interests in Bulgaria. At the present time, however, there is a marked scarcity of draft animals and, in accordance with Article 127 of the Treaty of Neuilly, a further reduction in their number is to be made. This would seem to indicate that, with proper sales methods, a market therefor could be developed. Contrary factors, however, exist, i. e., the high cost of tractor fuel (gasoline selling to day at about 40 cents per gallon and fluctuating in price with the changing and uncertain rate of exchange of the Bulgarian lev) and the scarcity of experienced help to care for the machines.

At the beginning of this year there was an appreciable demand for small threshers and small oil engines, steel ploughs of European style and harrows of the pegtooth design, and prospects for next year are very much the same, providing the hoped-for improvement in the rate of exchange of Bulgarian currency taken place. It has been stated, also, that the centralisation of all exports of cereals has had an unhealthy effect en local production, but it is to be hoped that the prospective legislation for the modification of the regulations governing the organisation of the Consortium will correct any such tendency.

4. Conclusion. Bulgaria should, if properly exploited, prove an excellent field for the introduction of American farm tools and machinery and smal-

tractors. In addition to naturally favorable conditions, both the Government and the people are favorably disposed towards Americans and American products. An American firm desiring to enter this field should send a representative to Bulgaria, should consider carefully the question of extended credits to rural buyers and should be prepared to establish an extensive community sales service, for it is only by personal community work that the peasant can be induced to adopt modern methods.

The Economic Future of Turkey

Few nations have suffered in recent years to such an extent as Turkey, which it must be remembered, has been in an almost continual state of war since 1910. The remaining Anatolian provinces, which, since the "reforms" of Mahmoud II (1808-39) and his successor Abdul-Medjid (1839-61), have borne the entire burden of misrule from within and attacks from without, have been desolated and laid waste to a still greater extent as the result of the great war; and it is now proposed to detach the two richest and most fertile of these provinces, Aidin and Adana, from the remainder, a measure which is likely to result in the emigration of the Turkish element, which forms the great bulk of the population, to other parts of Anatolia. The immediate effect of this would be the rapid decline of Smyrna, which in any event will lose much of its importance as a commercial center by being cut off from the Anatolian hinterland.

Although the loss of these two provinces, Aidin with its olives, figs, raisins, licorice-root and cotton, and Adana with its cotton, together with the fact that the ports of these provinces constitute the natural outlet of the interior of Anatolia, is very serious, there are nevertheless some redeeming features to be taken into consideration. A glance at the Turk-

ish agricultural statistics for 1329 (1913-4) shows that the real wealth of the country lies in the Anatolian provinces which heretofore have been the chief producers, and that in the way of production the Arab and Kourdish provinces have done very little, but on the contrary have been a source of expenditure. It would accordingly seem that, if Turkey could disband its army, which likewise has been recruited almost entirely from the Anatolian provinces, there would be such a vast number of hands available for agriculture, that despite the depopulation caused by the wars, a period of prosperity

would set in. History indeed shows that agricultural countries recover quickly from great catastrophes and the remaining Turkey is in every respect an agricultural country.

Although some time will be necessary before things reach their normal condition, Constantinople, which is likely to remain part of the empire, will, as a result of its geographical position, continue to remain the distributing center for a very large region, the exact extent of which cannot now be prognosticated. From the American point of view it must also be remembered that the elimination of a great part of the former European competition greatly favors the increase of American trade throughout the entire Levant, especially as the credit question, heretofore the greatest hindrance to the introduction of American goods into Turkey, has now practically ceased to exist.

Doubtless the most practical way for

Americans to obtain a commercial foothold in Turkey would be to arrange for an exchange of American manufactured articles for Turkish raw materials. Although the Anatolian provinces will be in a position to export various kinds of grain and oil seeds, the chief articles of interest to American importers are : Tobacco, Licorice-root, Opium, Meerschaum, Silk, Gum Tragacanth, Wool, Mohair, Goats' Hair, Attar of Roses, Guts (Sausage casings), Bees' wax, Dried fruits, a few drugs such as Scammony and possibly certain tanning and dyeing materials such as Valona, Gall-Nuts, etc. Besides these, antiquities and works of art as well as the products of that famous Turkish industry which the Seljuks brought with them from Central Asia, might be mentioned. I mean carpet weaving. In exchange for these articles the United States could supply those manufactured articles which are most needed, care-

fully excluding for the time being, at least, all objects of luxury. First in line come agricultural implements and machinery. Wanted are light plows of the Rud-Sack type which will not plow too deeply, as in many parts of Anatolia this brings salts to the surface; further, mowers, reapers and threshers.

All attempts to introduce steam plows have thus far proved unsuccessful, partly for the reason above mentioned, and partly owing to the lack of repair shops. There should, however, be a demand for milling machinery and railway material. All kinds of wearing apparel and textiles are also much needed. Although the Turkish textile factories have made much progress during the war, it is doubtful whether they will be in a position to meet the demand. Food stuffs, such as sugar, flour and fats, will be much needed for some time to come. Owing to the disturbances

in the olive producing districts doubtless much cottonseed and oleo oil will have to be imported.

In closing it seem, necessary to say a few words about the Turks themselves as business men, seeing that the national movement has now taken such deep root even in commercial matters that it cannot altogether be disregarded by those desiring to enter into commercial relations with the country. There was a time when the entire silk trade of Asia was in the hands of Turks and the caravan routes from China to the Levant were the achievements of this nation. The Ottoman Turks, however, have of late years become more and more a race of government officials. This was due in part to a faulty school system (whose sole aim even at present seems to be to direct the scholar's attention as far as possible from production and from a knowledge of his

own affairs) and partly owing to the system of military service and capitulations which put the Turkish element at a great disadvantage economically. Recognizing, however, that the decline of political power was chiefly the result of the loss of economic power, a movement set in a few years ago for the purpose of nationalising the economic apparatus. With this end in view the Turks have for some time past been directing their attention to commercial pursuits, establishing business houses in their own country and endeavoring to develop and extend their activities to other countries. They have learned much and will undoubtedly achieve success in this new field of their activity.

According to a report of the Swedish Consul General in Cairo, the

Egyptian Ministry of Agriculture will make a trial with motor tractors in the fall of 1920, in connection with an exposition in Cairo. Manufacturers are requested to address "Les Secrétaires Organisateurs des Essais de Motor-Tracteurs du Ministère de L'Agriculture" in Cairo.

The importation of foreign goods into Egypt is subject to practically no restrictions. There are exceptions only for certain goods mentioned in the customs tariff, as hashish, American cotton seed, explosives, etc., and gold in coins and bars.

The duty on imported merchandise amounts to 8 per cent. ad valorem, with the following exceptions: 4 per cent, ad valorem on coal, charcoal, wood for fuel, liquid fuel, petroleum, cattle, sheep, goats, beef and mutton, fresh or frozen. The duty on alcohol and distilled spirits is 10 per cent. Chemicals, fertilizers, books and other printed matter are free of duty. There

are special rates for tobacco. Wheat and wheat flour are free of duty. Quay fees are $4\frac{1}{2}$ per cent, per thousand and the municipal impost in Alexandria 1.05 per thousand of the value of the imported goods. The municipal imposts at Port Said are only 1 per thousand. The ad valorem duties mentioned are calculated according to the value of the imported goods in the country of origin at the time of exportation, including all freight, insurance and other charges. The value of certain kinds of goods (e. g. metal and textile goods) is fixed for longer periods, but never for more than one year, and the duty is calculated according to this established value. These provisions apply to merchandise from all countries.

PALESTINE**Business and Finance**

By Elias Thos. Gelat, B. C.

The population of old Palestine, i. e. from the Suez Canal to Nablus and the sea coast to the Jordan, has been estimated at about 700,000. The boundaries have been extended northwards to beyond Acca (near Tyre) and the eastern limit would, it is supposed, be made to include the granary of Palestine, viz:—the country east of the Jordan, with considerable increase in population.

The Moslem population, more than 90% of which is represented by those in rural districts and the tillers of the soil, owns a large share of the land; and the rest are artisans and workers in cities, and the wealthy class, the property owners. None of this large mass would trust their money to the

banks. It is forbidden by Mohammedan law to receive interest for money loaned. Hence the Moslems invest in land, houses, business dealings, and when money is actually loaned, the interest is so arranged that it is paid in a specified commodity.

The Christians and Jews have the commerce in their hands, either in export or import, and the Jewish element is getting some hold on the land and agriculture by establishing colonies, engaging in agricultural pursuits and in raising grain and fruits in a more scientific and business like manner.

However, by far the largest percentage of the non-Moslem population lives largely either on charity or remittances from abroad.

Emigration has been very active in late years from the villages around Jerusalem, partly to find better employment abroad and partly to escape

from military service under Turkish rule. These emigrants have generally done well, and most of their earnings are sent back home, either to build property or invest them otherwise, or for the support of their parents and relatives who depend upon them.

On the other hand there has been a considerable Jewish immigration. Some of these immigrants are young and active and their presence will be of great benefit as they engage in agricultural and colonizing enterprises, and improve the land, but the large majority is represented by the elderly men and women, who after spending their most active years abroad come to retire and die in Palestine, and whose support is from abroad.

Palestine, as a Holy Land, possesses a very valuable asset with its historical and religious associations; these are exploited by representatives of all religions and races. The Christians as well as the Jews maintain large charitable institutions, as orphanages, hospitals, soup kitchens, free dwellings, etc., which are supported by collections and subscriptions from abroad. Every sect or community, both Christian and Jewish aims to be represented.

The trade of Palestine for 1913, the last full year before the war, was a little more than one and one quarter million pounds Sterling for import, and a little more than half of this amount for export. The most important article for import is cotton goods and that of export is fruits (oranges); each of these represents about one-fifth and one-third of the respective totals, in value. The balance of trade was against Palestine, nevertheless values for the difference have never been sent out in compensation, but are each year invested in the land, and rather represent a part of money actually coming in.

The direct result of the very valuable asset of Palestine, which we mentioned above, is the tourist business, forming the most important affair for Jerusalem and immediate vicinity, where industries and agriculture, for lack of materials and suitability, are not developed. A large population depends on the short season for their earnings of the year.

The number of richer tourists that come to Palestine averages five thousand per annum, and that of pilgrims is from 20,000 to 30,000. The funds brought out by the former are either in cheques, letters of credit or banknotes, and the pilgrims provide their means with cash and foreign paper currencies.

It is rightly presumed and expected that under the present rule, affording liberty and security for life and wealth, the latent possibilities of the land either in agriculture, mines, etc. will surely be developed. Public enterprises will follow, and better accommodation and rail connection with Egypt being provided, a large number of tourists will bestow the benefit of their visits upon the population.

The development of petroleum and its by-products in the valley of the Dead Sea, and the large deposits of salt, bitumen, sulphur, phosphates, magnesium, etc., has already attracted attention. The war has set back many projects of public utility, the realization of some of which have matured, as the concession of electric light and power, electric tramway, a water supply and sewage system for Jerusalem, while tramway, electric light and power as well as an irrigation scheme, with the building of a suitable port at Jaffa were well under consideration.

It is reported that Egypt has enjoyed the privilege of entertaining about 50,000 first class tourists, whose visit

was a large source of income to the land. Palestine, its immediate neighbour, owing to the lack of a harbour, easy access and means of communications, contented itself with one-tenth of this number, although Palestine boasts over its neighbour country a climate suitable at all seasons, within a very short radius. It would be a very conservative estimate to say that in the future, within a reasonable time, until such facilities are provided, at least one-half of the number of tourists visiting Egypt will extend their journey to Palestine, as Jerusalem would be but ten hours distance by rail.


The banking institutions already working in Palestine are: The Crédit Lyonnais, the Imperial Ottoman Bank, the Deutsche Palestina Bank (closed after the occupation), the Anglo-Palestine Co. Ltd., the banking department of Messrs. Thos. Cook & Son, a few local banks, and the recent arrivals: the Anglo-Egyptian Bank and the Banco di Roma.

The service of banks is required to exchange the remittances from abroad to private individuals; to exchange the transfer of the very large amounts that are received by the charitable and religious institutions for their maintainance and donations; and to finance the trade, in imports as well as in exports, and to accommodate the tourists in all their financial matters; and these affairs seem sufficient to provide a good field for an additional house of credit.

The deposits in banks are comparatively small from the native population. Generally the banks dispose of funds in current accounts that are received to meet the ordinary expenses of schools, religious institutions, which are regularly replenished, thus keeping up a continuous movement.



The banks in general pay 3% interest on current accounts, and 4% on fixed deposits for one year. The Deutsche Palestina Bank had, a few years before the war, opened a savings bank department granting 3½% interest. The Crédit Lyonnais grants 3% on fixed deposits, and although no interest is allowed on current accounts, it is a fact that some people of means, more anxious for security than small interest, deposit their funds under those conditions until they find better investment, viz:—8 to 10% first mortgage on real estate, etc.

On the other hand, open current accounts guaranteed by two signatures bear 9% interest, while advances against stocks or bonds bear 7% annually. Certain of the banks make loans against goods, up to 60% of the value of the goods. The rent of the depot and other titles are usually transferred to the bank until

full satisfaction of the obligation. Nominal commissions are charged for collection of acceptances, and 3% is usually charged for collection of rent on behalf of property owners.

A special practice of financing orange exports in Jaffa is exercised by private individuals and banks in advancing the price on consignments, after effecting full insurance. The shipment is then made in the name of the lender, and payment is received in his name. There is very little risk in the transaction, and the fixed commission is quite secure. On the other hand, the small merchant is enabled by the advance to buy other lots for repeating the consignment under the same conditions.

An American bank, well managed and competently manned, certainly would greatly facilitate the introduction of American goods, which trade will ultimately prove to be a strong supporting pillar to that institution.

Although the sea coast offers a wider field for transactions based on trade, the business of a center, such as Jerusalem, with its central position and easy communication with Egypt and Syria, and its unique attractions for the tourist and religious trade, should not be overlooked.

A banking establishment with headquarters at Beirut, and branches at Aleppo, Damascus, Haifa, Jaffa and Jerusalem would have large business possibilities and success.

The Market in Syria

The principal products of Syria are cereals, silk, oranges, citrons, dried fruits—especially raisins and apricots—and tobacco.

The harvests this year have been fairly good. The market has also been supplied with grain from the Hauran and flour from abroad, and prospects for the winter are reassuring. It will be the endeavor of the authorities to maintain reasonable prices.

The orange trees and those of other citrus fruits have been injured somewhat by storms. At Beirut the harvest of citrons will be 40% below that of last year; at Tripoli 75% below and at Sidon 50%. On the other hand the crop at Jaffa will be very abundant. Orange trees suffered less than the citron trees, and the crop will be above that of the citron trees.



The cost of crating is very high as the country has been deforested and the importation of the wood and paper necessary is very expensive. Also the rate of exchange brings up the price of the fruit and adds another obstacle to exportation.

Happily this is not the case with apricots and raisins from the region of Damascus. Favored by the weather the harvest of these fruits this year is four times as abundant as the harvest of last year. The price of apricots at Damascus is from 15 to 17½ piasters (gold) the oke, or (25 cents the pound) Apricot paste sells at Damascus at 8 ½ piasters (gold) the oke.

Aden as a Market for Shoes

(From Consular report, Aden, Arabia.)

Aden, Arabia, is not an important market for shoes and shoe accessories. The European population is small and the natives do not generally wear shoes. There is no rain and the climate is hot throughout the year. A few American shoes have been sold, but there are at present none in stock in any stores dealing in shoes. American polishes, principally tan and white, and Amer-

ican laces of the same color can be sold to a limited extent. During the fiscal year ended March 31, 1919, Aden imported 8,729 pairs of leather shoes or sandals valued at \$8,971, mainly from Great Britain and India. Those American shoes that reach the Aden market usually come through London jobbers and are credited as British products in the Aden import returns. Shoes of cloth and of other materials, mainly for native use, were imported to the number of 37,261 pairs, valued as \$16,608 during the year above noted. Shoes of this class also come mainly from Great Britain. The import statistics give no separate statistics for accessories.

American shoes are liked in the Aden district and should sell well within the limits of the market. No local firm, however, features shoes, and shoe stock is jumbled up with other general lines of merchandise. Many of the European population have to send to Europe for their shoes simply because local dealers will not take the trouble to carry stock of the European. All business firms in Aden do business with the local branch of the National Bank of India (Ltd.). The currency unit employed in Aden is the Indian rupee, and Aden merchants prefer quotations either in ruppees or in sterling. Aden is a free port, excepting for a small tax or duty on alcoholic liquors or preparations, intoxic-

eating drugs, and arms and ammunitions. There is an excellent harbor into which large ships come, but the handling of all cargo is by means of lighters because of the lack of docks or wharves suitable for the use of steamers.

Attar of Roses

Rose culture and the manufacture of the essence of roses in Bulgaria have lately experienced essential modification; this has considerably influenced the foreign market. The competition between the Bulgarian attar of roses and that of Anatolia has developed without the Bulgarian producer having emphasized sufficiently in the foreign market the quality of the Bulgarian oil. Attar of roses is one of the chief products of Bulgaria and the state has always prided itself on the superior quality of this article from its choicest rose fields; but this year in Bulgaria the yield of roses is not up to the previous harvest owing to an affection of the bush. This latter fact caused a rise in price from lewas 1.20-1.50 the kilo (2.2 lbs.) of the previous year to lewas 4.50-5.50 (\$1.00 at lewas 45) for the raw material. The price labor is also higher than last year.

The attar of rose merchants have therefore decided not to sell their product this year under lewas 20,000 the kilo, and, with emphasis upon competition with other sources only in quality, they have decided to specialize on the purest rose oil for export.

Demonstration of American Agricultural Machinery

On several afternoons in the latter part of the month there was a demonstration of an American tractor plow at the farm of Hafiz Hussein, at Toptchilar, just outside the walls of Stamboul, under the auspices of the Standard Commercial Export & Finance Corporation, an American firm with branch offices in the Levant.

Mr. Clarence Moore, an expert mechanic, was in charge of the demonstration, which involved plowing several different types of soils.

A large number of farmers and capitalists attended the demonstration; among these were the Director of Agriculture for the Vilayet of Constantinople, Mr. Theodore E. Constantinides, and the Director of the Ottoman Agricultural School. Mr. Choren, Director of the "Model School", an agricultural institution, was also present. Mr. Abrévaya, from the American Consulate, was present and assisted in interpreting to the cosmopolitan spectators.

The speed of the tractor in comparison with the plow, especially the ox-driven plow, still so extensively used in this country, and the ease with which it handled even the hardest soil created most favorable comment. The ox-driven plow covers in 10 hours from 1 to 1½ deunums (0.22-0.33

acre), while the tractor is able to plow about 22 deunums (5 acres) in the same time. The contrast was at hand in a field of 10 deunums near by on which a native had been at work with a yoke of oxen for four days, but which had not been finished in that time. The press in all languages has given enthusiastic report of the demonstration.

The results of the demonstration entirely justified the undertaking, and although devoted exclusively to the interests of the "Moline" tractor, it has awakened a great interest in all kinds of American agricultural machinery for Turkey, the sale of which may be expected to assume important proportions, as soon as the conditions in Asia Minor permit of opening up the country's agricultural resources to these implements.

The Minister of Agriculture plans the organization of a special bureau in his department which will have in charge the education of the native farmers to the use of the modern agricultural implements.

The "Moline" tractor has already been demonstrated by Mr. Moore in Bulgaria, at Saloniki and at Smyrna, and a further exhibition is intended for Rumania. In all these fields the tractor has found admirers of its work, and buyers.

RUMANIA

(*Bulletin of Guaranty Trust Co.*)


A Royal Decree with the force of law has been promulgated in Rumania, in accordance with which the Ministry of Commerce and Industry is empowered to form Rumanian stock companies to exploit the domains, mines and factories of Reschitz, property of the privileged Austro-Hungarian State Railroad Company, as well as the mines and factories of Hunyad, formerly the property of the Hungarian State. In order to make Rumania

independent of foreign countries, the particular task of this company is to equip a factory for the production of arms and ammunition according to the instructions of the Rumanian Minister of War, and a factory for making the implements and tools necessary for the petroleum industry. The stock capital amounts to 125,000,000 lei, of which 75,000,000 lei in stock is to go to the privileged Austro-Hungarian State Railway Company as payment for its contribution in land, factories and equipment, while the remaining 50,000,000 is to be offered for subscription by the Rumanians.

The Rumanian-Swiss Commercial Syndicate was founded at the Rumanian Legation in Berne on June 25. Zurich manufacturers have participated with a capital of 1,000,000 francs. An exchange of merchandise between Switzerland and Rumania is to be brought about. Switzerland is to furnish principally electrical articles, and Rumania, petroleum products and grain. The Administrative offices are to be located in Basel.

The Syndicate is reported to have begun its activities already and to have sent two representatives to Bucharest. In view of the low rate of Rumanian currency and the difficulties of exporting petroleum from Rumania to Switzerland, it is not expected that the exchange of goods will assume great proportions.

According to the *Prager Tagblatt*, negotiations have been completed for the transportation of illuminating and fuel oil, benzine and crude oil from Rumania to Jugoslavia, Hungary, Austria and Germany on the Danube. The Bavarian-Lloyd, the South German Navigation Company and the Serbian Navigation Company are involved in this agreement and the participation of another company is anticipated. The arrangements made are to be extended later to other classes of goods.





Guaranty Trust Company Luncheon.

(From "The Orient", Rev. C. T. Riggs)

On Monday September 13th, the officers of the Constantinople office of the Guaranty Trust Company of New York gave a luncheon to representatives of the local press of the city, at which some fifteen or eighteen editors were royally entertained at the Pera Palace. The object of the luncheon was to place before the press the purpose and possibilities of the newly established American banking house, which is the sixth branch to be formed of the New York company. It already has offices in London, Liverpool, Paris, Havre and Brussels; and, as stated the other day at the luncheon, it is represented in the management also of several corporations like the Asia Banking Corporation of China and the Philippines. The Manager, Mr. S. Metz, presided at the table, and in his address at the close of the repast, he referred to the various kinds of activity carried on by the Trust Company, assuring his guests that the purpose of the Bank in opening its branch here was not primarily to make money, but first of all to give its constituency every facility for the carrying on of their business on the most advantageous terms. His appeal to the journalists present was for their aid in placing the facts before the public, and for their sympathy in disseminating valuable information that might help business. Brief responses were made by Sefa Fikri Bey, Director of the Turkish press, and Ali Kemal Bey, the genial editor of the *Peyam-Sabah* each of whom voiced the satisfaction of the Constantinople public in the starting of an American bank in this capital.

The new offices of the Guaranty Trust Company are practically ready,

and the opening of the bank is planned for October 4th.

Mr. Sigmund Metz, the manager, before coming here was acting manager of the London office. Mr. R. Schellens is Secretary, and Mr. O. Claiborne, Assistant Secretary. The offices are in the new Yildiz Han, Galata

Constantinople Market

The past month has seen little amelioration of the market. The surrounding territory has sent larger supplies of the more perishable goods for the more immediate needs of the city, vegetables, fruits, &c., but the area in Asia Minor as market for the stocks through Constantinople remains quite as restricted. Sevastopol and southern Russia have furnished one outlet; the Rumanian market has been more difficult on account of the further depreciation of the lei.

Prices on first necessities, groceries, &c. have fluctuated considerably, but prices on cloth and articles of dress have not fallen and the stocks on hand must be taken care of before the market will feel the decline which is reported at the factories in the countries of production. Retail prices here do not indicate a change. The large profits realized the first year after the armistice have enabled many firms to tide over the transitional period fairly satisfactorily, and the removal of the barriers to regions restricted up to the present is hopefully anticipated. The demands for winter give some activity, and it is believed that this winter will be the force majeure for liberation of commerce.

Fifty-eight Ford cars have reached the city during month, besides a number of other American cars, and Constantinople absorbs these very quickly. The street car strike in the spring inaugurated the "jitney" service—jitney is a misnomer in this country;—during the





U. S. Without Coastwise Privileges in Greece

A recent note from the United States chargé d'affaires at Athens is to the effect that the representative of a large American shipping firm states that the shallow harbors in most of the Greek ports and the restricted dimensions of the Corinthian Canal would make it almost impossible for American steamers engaged in European trade to utilize coastwise privileges in Greece. The present arrangement of collecting Greek products from the different parts of Greece and from the islands at Piraeus and Patras, when they are transshipped to American steamers, is the only practical one, given the average dimensions of the steamers now flying the American flag.

The only foreign countries having coastwise shipping privileges in Greece are the United Kingdom and Italy. A special treaty would have to be entered into in order that the United States might enjoy the same privileges.

Iron Ore Discoveries in Russia

According to Swedish reports enormous deposits of magnetic iron ore exist near the town of Kursk on the borders of the Ukraine. This discov-

ery is the result of 24 years of systematic surveys carried out by Dr. Ernst Leyst, formerly professor of geology at Moscow University, who died in 1918, but whose papers were rescued and brought to Sweden, where they were examined by Dr. Valfrid Petersson, professor of mineralogy at the School of Mines, and by Mr. Nathorst, mining engineer to the Swedish Iron and Steel Association. It is stated that these experts have come to the conclusion that magnetic deviations of unprecedented intensity and extent established by Professor Leyst can only be explained on the assumption that they arise from enormous deposits of iron ore, running in two parallel lines in the direction northwest southeast and situated at a distance of 37 miles from each other. Both lines have a length of about 57 miles and consist of a series of ore bodies, but it is impossible solely on the basis of Professor Leyst's magnetic charts to estimate accurately the extent, quantity, or quality of the beds.

Passenger Traffic Through Suez Canal

Last year 527,502 passengers passed through the Suez Canal as compared with 105,914 passengers in 1918.

This is the largest number of passengers which has ever traversed the Canal in any single year. Of the
